- Int 1569-2017** A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to prohibiting disorderly behavior

Res 1660-2017 Resolution urging the Governor to sign into law A5667A/S4769A, in relation to gravity knives.

T2017-6704 Resolution opposing H.R.367/S. 59, known as “the Hearing Protection Act of 2017,” eliminating the transfer tax on firearm silencers and treating any person who acquires a firearm silencer as meeting any registration or licensing requirements of the National Firearms Act with respect to such silencer.

T2017-6706 Resolution calling on Congress and the President to oppose H.R.38/S.446, known as the “Concealed Carry Reciprocity Act of 2017,” and related bill S. 446 known as the “Constitutional Concealed Carry Reciprocity Act of 2017” which would allow a resident from one state who has a license to carry a concealed handgun to lawfully carry his or her handgun in a different state, regardless of the licensing eligibility standards in the other state.
