SPEAKER MARK-VIVERITO: Good afternoon to
all my colleagues; I first wanna say that I, as well
as the Public Advocate were on the floor prior to
1:00, so we are starting on time, for all intents and
purposes. So just very quickly, I wanted to indicate
that today we will be voting on a series of Committee
Chairmanships and assignments out of the Rules
Committee, which had met earlier. I wanna thank
Chair, Brad Lander and the members of the Committee,
as well as all the staff for their hard work on these
assignments, as [background comments] as I had
indicated in the Committee meeting earlier today,
this actually comes after a lot of deliberation and
individual conversations with Council Members about
issues of concern, areas of work that they would like
to address, and so these Committee Chair assignments
that we will vote on today are a reflection of our
City's diversity and values. These Committees will
shape the Council's legislative agenda, help bring
New Yorkers closer to their government and provide
the oversight that we need to hold the administration
accountable.

In the coming months we will tackle the broader issue of Rules and Reform which will empower

committees and Council Members to make sure that all voices are heard within the Council.

So again I wanna thank all my colleagues and to welcome them all; I know we had a meeting two weeks ago and I thank you very much for the expressions of support and unity in the two weeks since I was elected Speaker. You have my commitment that this body will operate in a unified way to accomplish all the work ahead of us on behalf of New York City and on behalf of our constituents.

And with that I would like to ask the Chair of the Rules Committee, Brad Lander, to say a few words.

Speaker and thank you for your leadership in this process over the last couple of weeks, I'm very proud today as Chair of the Rules Committee and thanks to the other committee members we are bringing forward to this body a proposed slate of committee chairs and members and officers that I believe will enable this Council to move strongly forward into our new term under the Speaker's leadership and that all New Yorkers, when they look at the body, when they watch those exciting Committee hearings late at night, will

feel confident that their voice is represented and
that there's somebody there asking the questions;
exploring the issues that they want explored. The
chairs and leaders represent the diversity of the
City, of our boroughs, of this body and bring a real
wide range of relevant life experience and expertise.
I'm excited that the chair of our Public Education
Committee is a 25-year public school teacher who's
been a leader on issues of public education, making
our schools can be the best they can. I'm excited
the chair of our Public Housing Committee, somebody
who grew up in public housing and has been organizing
and assisting tenants that's gonna make sure that
they get what they need. I'm excited that the chair
of the Sanitation Committee, Antonio Reynoso, lives
in a district that has been burdened by unfairness of
our current solid waste policies and will be able to
bring that perspective to chairing the committee.
The chair of our Health Committee is the first openly
HIV-positive member of this body and I could go on an
on. We are bringing to the people of New York City
leadership and committee chairs and committee members
who feel passionately about the issues that this
Council's gonna face, who have the experience and

expertise and bring themselves to that process in a
way that's gonna move us strongly forward. That
means that we've got leadership and committees that
can work closely with the De Blasio administration on
our shared agenda of reducing inequality, creating
good jobs, preserving affordable housing, addressing
issues of resiliency and rebuilding; we're creating a
new committee, ending the old Committee on Lower
Manhattan Rebuilding created after 9-11, and creating
a Committee on Recovery and Resiliency, chaired by
Council Member Mark Treyger, that will help us move
forward to rebuild after Sandy and make sure that the
City is resilient and ready for future actions that
come with climate change and the leaders and chairs
we're proposing today will also stand ready to hold
the De Blasio administration accountable and will not
flinch to exercise this body's responsibilities under
the Charter to identify areas of concern, to ask
tough questions, to do the investigations necessary,
and improve the functioning of government; the people
of the City have the right, under the Charter, to
know that members of this body are doing everything
they can, both to work with the administration and to

hold them accountable and I'm proud of the slate we're bringing forward today.

I will just note for people, there are two documents that have come out of Rules Committee - Resolution 0001 provides that titles and descriptions of the committees and subcommittees, a couple of minor amendments to the Rules, including so that we aren't in violation of our Rules if we don't have meetings of every committee this month, in January, when we're just getting set up, and the accompanying message, M 0013 provides committee assignments, allowances, officers of the Council and the creation of new committees and subcommittees, such as the one I mentioned.

I wanna say thank you again to the

Speaker for her leadership and the team that worked

with her and especially recognize the staff that put

in a lot of time and especially a late night last

night in the blizzard -- Amata LaBooth [phonetic],

Nadeer [phonetic] Joshua, Gary Altman, Joe Toronto,

Rachel Goodman, and Michael Premanschnap [phonetic],

thank you all for your work in putting this forward

and we're grateful for the opportunity to bring the

ACTING PRESIDENT PRO TEMPORE JAMES:
You'll have an opportunity at a later point.

COUNCIL MEMBER WILLIAMS: Oh my bad. [laughter] So we're just voting on the committee assignments; I'll speak on that. First I wanna say, thank you for having me be considered for the position that I am; I wanna thank the Speaker; I do have some concern and I was actually trying to figure out how I would vote even up until as I came here; that there is not... I think it was a very tough thing to do and trying to balance everything; my hope was that diversity would've been considered a little bit more; I am concerned about blacks in powerful leadership positions actually across the City, particularly with the role that they played in getting a lot of the issues forward and getting people where they were. [background comment] So it concerned that we haven't achieved that yet. have decided that I have faith in Madame Speaker, I have faith in my friend who I supported and I'm

looking forward to see what we're going to do to make
sure that this is dealt with moving forward, and even
though it was not accomplished here, and the issues
in other assignments and other things, the issues
that are concerned of all folks, including the black
population is a little better realizing a little
better put forth optically so people can see it. So
I vote aye with that expectation moving forward and
going forward and with faith that my friend and
Speaker who I voted for has heard of all these things
and will make sure it moves forward the way the it
should. Thank you.
