Good afternoon. I am Jim Gennaro, Chair of the

Committee on Environmental Protection. Today we will

hold a vote on three important bills: Intro 51-A,

sponsored by Council member Perkins would require the

director of the Mayors Office of Sustainability in

consultation with an agency to be designated by the

Mayor to conduct a study for the installation of

geothermal energy systems on government owned sites.

The bill would require that a study be conducted

first to see what potential sites could be

retrofitted with such systems and then to select 10

government owned buildings that could have geothermal
systems installed in order to demonstrate the
suitability of such systems. The bill would also
require reporting on the project and recommendations

respecting whether the bill should be expanded to

7 private properties.

Next bill. Proposed Intro number 2425-A, sponsored by Council member Salamanca, would authorize the Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Protection to assign the borough Commissioner to each borough within DEP who would be tasked with appointing a Commissioner regarding personnel, programs, and facilities within the borough and to liaise with borough presidents, Council members, another DEP borough commissioners and also community boards. This law would take effect 90 days after it becomes law.

Finally, Intro 2460, sponsored by me, and an enforcement provision for the city's 12-year-old Brownfields Law. In May 2009, Mayor Bloomberg signed into law the New York City Brownfields and Community Revitalization Act, also authored by me. The law provides the city's Office of Environmental Remediation, known as OER, with broad authority to

5 assistance to qualifying Brownfield properties
