5	Member colleague Jumaane Williams indicates he
6	is a powerhouse and truly respected leader in
7	the faith community. Thank you for all that
8	you do. Also, I just want to tell my
9	colleagues that as comfortable as we are
10	sitting in this Chamber, more likely we'll be
11	making some seating arrangements. So don't get
12	too comfortable right now. Just kidding.
13	Also, let me just say that I really want to
14	clearly express and I want it to be very
15	clearly understood to all my colleagues that I
16	truly welcome the feedback and the thoughts and
17	the thinking that people express, whether on
18	this floor or whether in private or whether in
19	group setting. I really do value getting
20	feedback to inform and be able to be a more
21	deliberative, respectful, inclusive body. So I
22	thank those colleagues that have expressed the
23	concerns that they have. I welcome it. Know
24	that it is seriously something that I do take
25	into account as we move forward and that will

always be welcome. Today I want to say that we 2. 3 are introducing legislation that will expand the paid sick time law that we passed last 4 session. This legislation which was requested 5 by the Mayor, but which will receive full 6 review and consideration by the Council will provide paid sick days to 500,000 more workers 8 in our City. I want to thank Council Member 9 10 Margaret Chin for serving as the lead sponsor 11 and the many colleagues who have signed on 12 before introduction. And there's still 13 obviously opportunity for council colleagues to 14 continue to sign on. Additionally, we received the nomination of Mark Peters as the Commission 15 of the Department of Investigation, and that 16 17 will also receive a thorough vetting. And just to note, that we will not be voting on the 18 over-rides of Mayoral vetoes today. Those will 19 be heard in Committees and considered by the 20 21 Full Council at the next Stated. Lastly, I just want to say that I would encourage Council 22 Member Colleagues, that they should check the 23 24 attached announcement to today's agenda, look at the website for the Committee assignments 25

2.4 COUNCIL MEMBER CHIN: Thank you. I'm proud to sponsor the legislation today that 25

2	will ensure that all hard-working New Yorkers
3	have the right to take a day off if they're
4	sick or if someone in the family is sick. This
5	bill does a number of important things
6	including expanding the definition of a family
7	member to cover a more modern idea of family,
8	including grandparents, grandchildren, and
9	siblings, addressing enforcement issues by
10	allowing the Mayor to designate another agency
11	besides DCA to enforce the act, requiring or
12	employers with five or more employees to be
13	required to provide earned pay sick times, and
14	is require employers with fewer than five
15	employees unpaid earned sick times. Other city
16	in the United States that have been operating
17	with pay sick leave laws for several years, I'm
18	proud to see New York City to join them today
19	in safeguarding what should be both a public
20	health concern and a human rights. That is the
21	idea that if you're sick or someone you take
22	care of is sick, that you do not need to be
23	afraid that you will lose your job or your
24	paycheck. No New Yorker should have to chose
25	between their health and their financial

2	security. I would like to thank our former
3	colleague borough President Gayle Brewer for
4	her hard work on this legislation, as well as
5	Speaker Mark-Viverito and Mayor de Blasio for
6	advocating for the expansion of this bill, and

8	that have already signed on, and I hope that
9	all the rest of my colleagues would also sign
10	on to sponsor this important legislation.
