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CHAIRPERSON GREENFIELD: Good afternoon my name is David Greenfield I'm a council member from the 44th councilman district in Brooklyn and I'm privileged to serve as the chair of the land use committee.

I'd like to welcome my esteemed colleagues who are members of the committee. Council member Gentile, council member Garodnick, council member Mealy, council member Mendez, council member Koo, council member Levin, council member Weprin, council Williams, council member Willis, council member Richards, council member Barron, council member Reynso, council member Torres and council member Ignizio.

I want to thank you all for your attendance today. Of course today our meeting is starting a couple of hours late due to the fact that we had two major projects that were being finalize and those negotiations happily are now complete. Specifically I'm referring to west 57th and to Domino Sugar. This of course leads back if you recall when we assumed this new committee. We made it clear that we would not hold emergency or special meetings of this committee so that to insure that we are fair,

equitable and transparent. And as a result we have in fact done that. I want to thank all the members' especially council member Steve Levin and council member Antonio Reynoso and my fellow chair Mark Werpin for adherering to that so that in fact the public and press could have more transparency. This is good government, this is good business and it's certainly works when you stick to the plan so it certainly grateful for that.

Speaking of my subcommittee chairs, I
want to thank subcommittee chair mark Werpin, Zoning
and Franchise is for his leadership, subcommittee
chair Peter Koo, Landmarks, Public Citing, and
Maritime Uses and of course subcommittee chair Inez
Dickens, Planning, Dispositions and Concessions.
Also before you I have the joint reports of the land
use, committees and applicable subcommittee for each
item we are voting today with proposed resolution for
each item. What the committee is voting on today is
to approve each of the less versions before you for
presentation and vote by the full council. The
resolution reflects the recommendation of the
applicable subcommittee. In addition today you will
also find a briefing a sheet which give you

additional information about the matters and other
matters which have been scheduled to be heard by the
subcommittee.

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Today we have the following applications on our calendars for our consideration. 1381 Rockaway Park rezoning, 140155 ZNK in council member Barron's districts is before of for a zoning map change to add a C2-3 overwrite to an existing R5D district which would allow a physical cultural establishment at this location in Canarsie Brooklyn AKA a gym. We also have before us 1582 Richmond Avenue rezoning 110106 ZMR in council member Meytayer's district to at a C1-2 overwrite to and existing R3X district. So it's to bring back into conformance and existing commercial development in the bulls heads sections of Staten Island. have before the 3 Sidewalk Café in our council member Mendez's district. 7A Café Mama Bar and the 4th have all been modified and of course the recommendations of the council member. We also have before us a special permit pursuant to NYCZR74-781 to allow retail uses on the ground floor and cellar of 59-61 Thompson Street in council member Johnson's district. And we also have before us a text amendment to

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Manhattan West in a special Hudson Yards district and council member Johnson's district which modifies the open space public access provisions resulting in an increase of the open spaces and more harmonious design of the spaces as well as modifying the parking provision and the construction phasing.

We have before us the designation the 88^{th} precinct station house on Classon Avenue in Brooklyn in council member Kambo's [phonetic] district 140254 HKK has a historic landmark district and we also have before a lease of the New York Health and Hospice Corporation in council member Eugene's district a building G on the Kings County Hospital campus To Camba for development of housing for the formally homeless as well as the affordable housing. We also have before us 3 applications relating to 606 West 57th street in council member Rosenthal's district as zoning text change a zoning map change and a special permit for parking. These applications are proposed to be modified reducing the maximum amount of parking to 400 spaces adding text that would require that any proposed hotel will need to obtain a special permit and be reviewed pursuant to Europe and importantly it

provided for additional middle income housing that would be permanently affordable.

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And finally today we are approving with modifications recommended by the zoning subcommittee the Domino Sugar Development in Waynesboro Brooklyn in council member Levin's district. This serious of applications will facilitate a large scale general development of a mixed use project containing significant residential and commercial and community facilities this is including a very large amount of permanently affordable housing. And So folks as you have noticed the members of the committee this is the most action packed meeting that we have had which also explain why we have some delays today. appreciate your patience and we certainly grateful to that. The subcommittees have recommended approval of these items all with the council member these items are located in this district have approved of these items as well. The chair recommends an I vote on all these matters and now we will now give any members that would like first to make comments if they like and then afterward ask any questions. member like to make any comments on any of these Council member Barron has a question. projects?

COUNCIL MEMBER BARRON: Ah, yes thank you
Mr. Chair. When the dominos project came to do
presentation I raised the question about parkland
because there was not an adherence to the designated
anchorage that had been indicated would be parkland.
Did they address that issue?

CHAIRPESON GREENFIELD: I'm going to turn it over to council member Levin so he can address that as the council member from the district.

COUNCIL MEMBER BARRON: Thank you.

Barron specifically no on that particular issue they

did not make up the additional parkland from what

they had initially committed.

that's and issue because we talk about parkland space and they had made that commitment to do that and since they have not honored that initial commitment that is reason for me to not support this. I understand this is a great project and I also have some issues about the levels of the AMI. Which I know is 28/80/20 but the fact that they did not address the parkland is an issue. Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON GREENFIELD: I would just

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point out just one point of clarification cause were on the record which is that why they did not address the parkland the council member with the administration did in fact address the AMI and has in fact guaranteed the levels of AMI at the council members and communities have been seeking. Just so you are aware of that. Which is a significant achievement and which is in fact what took us an additional a couple hours today but the council members were successful in marking in the level of AMI that is appropriate and will be in fact affordable and guaranteed affordability plus a larger mix of units for this particular project so there were in fact some significant concessions that were

I'm not going to name them because I'm certainly going to miss forget someone but I will tell you that that the staff and the council members were here till well pass 3 o'clock in the morning last night.
