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CHAIRPERSON LEVIN: [gavel] Good

morning, everybody. The hearing will come to

order. I am Council Member Steve Levin, chair of

the New York City Council's General Welfare

Committee. I am joined today by members of the

committee, Vanessa Gibson of the Bronx, Corey

Johnson of Manhattan, Carlos Menchaca of Brooklyn,

Annabel Palma of the Bronx.

Today we are going to be hearing a preconsidered resolution sponsored by Speaker Mark-Viverito and voting today on this resolution out of this committee. The pre-considered resolution and consideration today authorizes the Speaker to intervene and file an [muffled audio] or join an amicus brief on behalf of the City of New York, Council to the City of New York and any appeals in litigation captioned In Re: Bloomberg v. Lou and Neighborhood in the Ninety's Inc. v. The City of New York for the purpose of defending provisions of the New York City Administrative Code that limits the size of single adult shelters in New York City to 200 beds. Pursuant to Local Law 57 of 1998 the Council and active legislation prohibiting the Department of Homeless Services from operating a

shelter for single adults with a census of more than 200 individuals. The council originally passed this legislation to insure the health and safety of shelter residents by prohibiting the warehousing of individuals.

Recent litigation involving the former Mayor and Controller, DHS and a neighborhood group on the Upper West Side involving the Controller's refusal to register contracts for two shelters, raised the issue of the legality of Administrative Code Section 21-312(2)(b), the 200 bed limit for single adult shelters.

In the Order and Decision the Judge held that this law is preempted by the State Regulation of Adult Care Facilities and therefore, illegal. The council does not agree with the Judge's holding that this law is invalid. Due to the Council's strong interest in defending the legality of the Administrative Code's cap on the single adult shelter census and the Council's ability to enact laws related to the regulation of single adult shelters. This resolution authorizes the Speaker to intervene, file an Amicus Brief or
