CHAIRPERSON CHIN: Good Morning. I am Margaret Chin, Chair of the Aging Committee. We are here today to vote on two measures that we heard with the Finance Committee earlier this month. Int. 243-A, which would increase the income threshold for SCRIE from \$29,000 to \$50,000 for the next two years and Reso. 185, which support the Senate bill 1218 and the Assembly bills 1790 by Assembly Member Joel Millman and Senator Bill

Legislation that would automatically link future increases in SCRIE to the consumer price index. During our hearing, with Finance, we heard resounding support for both of these measures. But also, many reminders that the work surrounding SCRIE is not done. The State can do much more to improve the SCRIE program, the least of which, would be extending this income threshold, increased beyond 2016. I can assure the City seniors that this Committee and the Council will do all that we can to make sure that the thousands of seniors that will be added to the SCRIE program in July, won't face losing those benefits in just a few years.

COMMITTEE ON AGING

I again, want to thank my colleagues,
Council Member Ferraris(sp?), Williams and
Koslowitz, who co-sponsored these pieces of
legislation with me, and all the Aging Committee
members that have signed onto to the bill and
resolution. I committed to addressing the many
housing challenges that our seniors face, and I am
proud that the Committee is taking the first, of
what I hope, are many steps towards ensuring that
all seniors have access to stable and affordable
housing.

Would any of the co-sponsors like to make a statement, before we vote?

Council Member Koslowitz?

MS. KOSLOWITZ: Thank you, Madam
Chair. I think this is a wonderful thing that is
happening today. I know that my office has gotten
so many calls from people that were crying that
they... their... that they were losing their SCRIE
because of their social security went up a little
bit, and by minute numbers. And, this will help
all of them that have called my office, and many,
many that haven't called my office, or have called

2 the offices of my colleagues. This is a great day. We have to make sure it's consistent and keeps 3 going after the two years. We have to make sure 4

5 this is ongoing. So, we have to keep our eye on

scheduling the meeting earlier to help me out.

MR. VALLONE: I just want to thank our Chair for your leadership on this. We wouldn't have been able to get this quickly today without your guidance. And, it is critical to get this from \$29,000 to \$50,000, and I stand with you on concern and post 2016. So, we will be vigilant then, too.

CHAIRPERSON CHIN: Council Member, Rose? MS. ROSE: Thank you, Madam Chair. I want to thank the sponsors of these bills because, I too, in my district, I have many seniors who have suffered because of the cap remaining at \$29,000

2	for so long. And, in fact, just last night I as
3	visited by one of those seniors, and, um, she
4	didn't know about this legislation. And, she had
5	come in, once again, to complain and to say that
6	she had been added to a waiting list for a year and
7	a half, but they were going to put her on at the
8	market rate because she was over the guidelines.
9	And, so, there is going to be a need to inform
10	landlords that this… there has been this change, so
11	that our seniors will not continue to suffer. I am
12	very appreciative to all of the sponsors for this
13	legislation. Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON CHIN: Thank you, Council Member, Rose.

I believe we are all looking forward to getting the bill implemented, starting July 1st.

And, during the hearing, with the Finance

Committee, the Department of Finance representative that was there, told us that they were going to reach out to people who applied for SCRIE, and was rejected because their income was over. So, I think that is a great first step, but I think we are going to have a lot to do in terms of working together, to make sure that every senior and their

2	families in the City know that the bill has passed.
3	And, so we need to talk about how to do the
4	outreach. And, I also really want to thank our
5	speaker because it's really so exciting that we can
6	get legislation passed so quickly. So, it's a new
