As I mentioned at the hearing last week, the only way to shatter glass ceilings is to keep on addressing issues that hold women back from getting what they rightfully deserve, equality in all aspects. I'm glad that today we will be voting on a resolution in support of a state bill that will champion this issue with specific regard to income equality. The bill that Resolution 649 supports would guarantee workers in New York State the right to discuss their salary information without being penalized. This would make instances of wage discrimination easier to spot and to address. The bill would also discourage employers from unfair pay practices and increase damages up to 300% of unpaid wages for those who have been discriminated against.
