3	CHAIRPERSON FERRERAS-COPELAND: Good
4	morning and welcome to today's Finance Committee
5	Hearing. I'm Council Member Julissa Ferreras-
6	Copeland. I am the chair of the committee. We've
7	been joined by Majority Leader Van Bramer, Council
8	Member Rodriguez, Council Member Levine, Council
9	Member Cornegy, and Council Member Rosenthal. Today
10	we will, we have two items on our agenda;
11	resolution 572 regarding a pet adoption tax break
12	and a, and a BID item. Let's start with the
13	resolution 572 which I sponsored calling upon the
14	state to pass legislation which would provide a
15	hundred dollar tax credit to anyone who adopts a
16	dog or a cat from a shelter. The ASPCA estimates
17	that every year millions of dogs and cats are
18	euthanized because they are ot adopted into loving
19	homes. In New York City there are thousands of dogs
20	and cats available for adoption from shelters.
21	However we know the cost of adopting a dog or a cat
22	can be a burdensome, from, can be burdensome for
23	many families and may prevent some people willing
24	to open their homes for doing so. A hundred dollar
25	tax break credit would defray some of the initial
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cost and could incentivize people to adopt. 2 Encouraging New Yorkers to adopt a pet is not only 3 compassionate but also reduces the stress on the 5 financial resources of shelters that house these adopted animals, adoptable animals. And let's not 6 forget the many health benefits to people come from 8 owning a pet including improved cardiovascular 9 health, lower heart rate, and blood pressure 10 increase exercise in helping people make and keep social connections. I urge all my colleagues to 11 vote yes on this resolution and remember adopt, 12 don't shop. Next we have the item relating to the 13 lower east side BID in Council Member Chin's 14 district on May 14th, 2015 the committee approve 15 16 resolution 666 which sets today as a date to consider Intro 764, yeah 666 which would approve 17 certain amendments to the lower eastside BID 18 19 district plan. The lower eastside district, the lower eastside BID was first established in 1993. 20 The majority of the BID is comprised of, of ground 21 floor commercial units with residential units on 22 upper floors in most buildings. At this time the 23 BID is seeking council approval to amend its 24 25 district plan. The proposed amendment would change

the method of assessment by changing the formula by
which the assessments are calculated and by
creating two assessment sub-districts. One sub-
district would become prize of the tax loss within
the Seward Park extension urban renewal area and an
area that has largely sat vacant for more than 40
years and which is now being redeveloped. The other
sub-district would consist of the remainder of the
tax lots within the BID. The maximum amount that
the BID will be permitted to assess each year
stands at 974,600 dollars and will remain unchanged
by this district plan amendment. The BID also, the
BID would also like to modify its existing service,
most notable by including economic and community
development as a core service. Council Member Chin
supports the amendment to the district plan. For
further details on the district profile of the
lower eastside BID details regarding the changes in
the method of assessment and a description of the
services that are and will be provided please refer
to the committee report prepared by the finance
division staff and the attached proposed amended
district plan. Council Member Chin I'd like to open

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2 the mic up for Council Member Chin to address her
3 BID.

COUNCIL MEMBER CHIN: Good morning.

Thank you Chair Ferreras and member of the Finance Committee. Thank you for having this hearing today. I'm here to support Intro 764 which permits the amendment of the district plan of the lower eastside business improvement district. This proposal is to modify the existing service for the district and to change the method of assessment upon which the district charge is based. I'm confident that the proposed changes will maintain the level of quality service which needed for local businesses and to identify effective ways for our upcoming developments to contribute to this prospering neighborhood. The lower eastside has changed significant, significantly over the past two decades and the BID has operated since 1993 to accommodate the needs of the businesses in this area. We want to make sure that the existing business that makes up the historic and cultural fabric of this neighborhood continues to operate and receive the same level of services as currently provided by the lower eastside BID with the

2	upcoming Seward Park urban renewal area development
3	this neighborhood will undergo significant changes
4	as to how revenue is generated from and for the
5	local economy. The… development will result in the
6	loss of parking lot operation which is provided for
7	63 percent of the lower eastside BID's operating
8	budget. To ensure that the organization continue to
9	provide capacity building and support for local
10	economic development the proposed district plan
11	amendment takes into account the loss of the
12	parking lot revenue and incoming large scale
13	projects including hotels and other commercial
14	businesses. This plan also consider the recent
15	conversion of many properties into commercial
16	and/or residential condominiums. After meeting with
17	the leadership of the lower eastside BID I had
18	expressed concern about making sure that there's
19	equitable assessment rate among existing
20	properties, a new development that will occur
21	within the district. In collaboration with the
22	Small Business Services the BID was able to
23	determine a new assessment formula that promotes
24	advancement for existing businesses. It will also
25	ensure that new projects are able to contribute to

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2	the economic needs of the community. With the
3	amended district plan in place it will preserve mom
1	and pop shops that continue to operate within the
5	confine of the lower east side BID. I urge my
5	colleagues today to vote in support of this
7	proposed amendment district plan. Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON FERRERAS-COPELAND: Thank you Council Member Chin. Those are today's items. I will first open the floor up for questions or testimony on resolution 572. Okay. And then we will hear... if we have additional questions on the BID SBS is here to ask any questions. They're going to forego their opening statement I'm sure. Unless you all want to hear the opening state... okay, alright, excellent. We'll give you a copy Council Member Chin. And anyone else who wishes to speak on the lower eastside BID? No? Oh, okay. You want to speak during your vote? Yeah okay. Okay. Before I have Billy Martin the committee clerk call the roll I want to remind my colleagues that the Finance Committee will resume executive budget hearings tomorrow at 10:00 a.m. in the chambers. Tomorrow's hearing will be held jointly with the Committee on Education. And we will hear from the Department of

10	BID. It's a really big deal. I vote aye on all.

12	eight in the affirmative, zero in the negative, and
13	no abstentions both items have been adopted.
14	CHAIRPERSON FERRERAS-COPELAND: So I
15	just wanted to make sure that we know that the
16	SBS's testimony will be submitted in writing for
17	the, in the official record with all the details
18	necessary we will keep the role open for another 15
19	minutes. Okay thank you.
20	COMMITTEE CLERK MARTIN: Council Member
21	Ignizio.
22	COUNCIL MEMBER IGNIZIO: I vote aye.
23	COMMITTEE CLERK MARTIN: Vote now stands
