2	CHAIR TREYGER: Good morning and welcome
3	to this hearing of the Committee on Recovery and
4	Resiliency, I am the Chair of the Committee, Council
5	Member Mark Treyger and today we will be holding a
6	second hearing and vote on proposed introduction 448-
7	A, sponsored by Council Member Alan Maisel in
8	relation to civil and criminal penalties for building
9	code violations resulting from certain work done in
10	response to a natural or manmade disaster and
11	proposed introduction 1037-A, sponsored by myself in
12	relations to violations received after a disaster.
13	Both of these bills stand for the simply principal
14	that people should not be penalized when a building
15	or sanitation violations is caused by something
16	outside of their control like a disaster or a
17	recovering program. Penalizing these people would
18	serve no public purpose and it might make a true
19	recovery from a disaster that much more difficult by
20	adding to their financial burdens and undermining the
21	public support for recovering programs. Proposed
22	introduction 1037-A would first provide building
23	owners with an extended period of time to repair
24	damages and clean their properties without penalty.
2.5	Next, it would exempt building owners from civil and

COUNCIL MEMBER MAISEL: Alright thank you Mr. Chairman. I'm very pleased that Intro. 448-A was voted on today. This legislation was designed to help protect property owners who rely on City recovery programs after an natural disaster. In the aftermath of Super Storm Sandy in my district alone we saw 100s of property owners struggle to find licensed professionals for need recovery work. New York City Rapid Repair and Build it Back Programs were formed and while the intention was good, some of the recovery efforts may have resulted in property owners receiving fines for that same work which was completed by the City's recovery programs designated contractors. In these cases it is critical that the City not penalize property owners for joining a program that elected officials and City agencies directed them to join. This legislation creates a

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process to protect building owners from civil and criminal penalties when the violation is for repair work done by a City disaster recovery program or its contractor. It also provides for a possible waiver or refund for any such violations previously issued since Super Storm Sandy. I would like to thank Recovery and Resiliency Committee Chairman Mark Treyger (inaudible) a co-sponsors, the members of this Committee and Committee Counsel Brad Reid for your commitment to passing this legislation will not only help property wrongly fined for Super Storm Sandy repairs but protect them from receiving violations for City contracted work completed after future, hopefully never but future natural or manmade disasters, so I'm very, very grateful for the Committee Members and I'm grateful for your work Mr. Chairman, thank you.

CHAIR TREYGER: Thank you very much

Committees work with your leadership as well already

helped a homeowner get a violation waived because we

brought it to the attention of City agencies, its...

its really something else but you know were proud to

have worked together on this and the goal is to get
