3 CHAIRPERSON GREENFIELD: Good morning.

SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Quiet please.

CHAIRPERSON GREENFIELD: My name is David Greenfield. I'm the Council Member from the 44<sup>th</sup>

Council District in Brooklyn. I'm privileged to serve as the chair of the Land Use Committee. I want to welcome my esteemed colleagues, who are members of the committee, Council Members Gentile, Palma,

Dickens, Garodnick, Rodriguez, Koo, Wills, Richards,

Cohen, Kallos, Reynoso, Torres and Treyger. I want to welcome Council Member Cohen's daughter. Thank you for joining us today. I know she's busy playing on her dad's iPhone. So, it's certainly more important than the work that we're doing here today.

I also want to thank—

COUNCIL MEMBER COHEN: [off mic] It's more interesting.

CHAIRPERSON GREENFIELD: It's more interesting for sure. That's fair. I also [laughs] want to thank Chair Dickens, Chair Koo and especially Chair Richards for their work on their respective subcommittees. There's been a lot of work in those subcommittees. We're going to be voting only on one

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application today, the rezoning of Broadway and Sherman Avenues, LU 422 and 423. Before I do so, I want to say a few words. I have been privileged to serve as the chair of this committee for over 2-12years, and in my time we have seen many countlesscountless difficult and controversial applications. Land Use discussions are broad (sic) and the most challenging ones that we have in the Council, and not just in the Council but in the entire city because of the fact that we live in a city that is growing, but that is running out of space. People from all over the world are continuing to come here, and families are deciding to stay here and raise their children, and that's great, but it also creates a serious need for new housing and especially new affordable housing. Our city's challenge is not if we grow, it's how we grow. As Chair Richards said we do not take decisions to vote lightly, and our job is to find compromise, to make the projects that we get before us better. It's what we have done literally hundreds of time since I've been chair, and it's what we will continue to do. Despite the enthusiasm and applause today in the Chair's view, today is not a happy day, and the reason is because we were not able

to find a compromise, which is something that we 2 3 always try for. Specifically, there were two issues 4 that were outstanding that were the issues around the building's scale. The proposal was for a 5 significantly larger building than could have and 6 7 would have been built as of right, and just to be 8 clear for those reporters who are out there, it's not just about height. I's also about the bulk of the building and what you can put on. The other piece of 10 11 it, which was something that we could not reach a 12 compromise on was on the affordability levels, and 13 that is a very significant issue. We do not have a 14 one-size-fits-all process in this city. We have 15 different communities. We have different 16 neighborhoods and different needs when it comes to affordability. To be clear, we did everything in our 17 18 power including literally pull up the Council's State 19 Meeting by two days today so that we can engage in 20 every opportunity to try to negotiate in good faith 21 to come to a deal. We did that, but we were not able 2.2 to do so, and the reality is that we have a long 2.3 tradition of respecting the individual council members especially when the council members have 24 legitimate land use rationales, which this council 25
