these bills today. We first learned about these two
bills earlier this year in the Speaker's State of the
City speech earlier in February in which she outline
a robust criminal justice agenda. Today's two bill
relate to the creating of neighborhood support teams,
and the creation of a municipal division of

Proposed Intro 1135-A will require the Mayor to appoint a department of official to oversee the coordination of efforts to address quality of life issues in our local communities. The coordinating agency will be required to designate at least three communities that would benefit from interagency coordination.

Proposed Intro 1150-A will create a municipal division of transitional services. The majority of individuals released from our city's jails leave without a discharge plan or access to services that would assist them to re-enter into the community after a period of incarceration. This bill, Proposed Intro 1150-A will create a coordinated system of re-entry services including access to

housing, job training and public benefits. The safety
of our city is of paramount importance, and it is
essential that we work together to support our
communities with all the tools available to us. Both
of these bills are a step in the right direction, a
good measure, and I encourage all of my colleagues to
join me today in voting in favor of these two pieces
