CHAIRPERSON GREENFIELD: Good morning. 3 My name is David Greenfield. I am the councilman 4 from the 44th District in Brooklyn. I'm privileged 5 to serve as Chair of the Land Use Committee. I want 6 to welcome my esteemed colleagues who are members 7 of the committee and joining us today: Council 8 Member Gentile, Council Member Dickens, Council 9 Member Garodnick, Council Member Mendez, Council 10 Member Rodriguez, Council Member Lander, Council 11 Member Rose, Council Member Richards, Council 12 Member Barron, Council Member Kallos, Council 13 Member Torres, Council Member Treyger. I want to 14 thank Chair Richards for his early attendance today 15 and would also like to thank him for his leadership 16 of the Zoning Subcommittee. I want to thank Chair 17 Dickens for her leadership and Chair Koo for his 18 work on the Landmark Subcommittee as well. We will 19 be voting on a resolution to modify three 20 applications and approve the remaining 21

Use Number 47995 Horatio Street, an application for

applications. These resolutions before you

the modification of restrictive declaration which

represent the recommendations of the subcommittees

for presentation and vote by the full council. Land

2	was previously approved to allow uses permitted by
3	the underlying C62A District in a 47 hundred square
4	foot ground floor space. We will be modifying this
5	application to maintain use restrictions on
6	restaurant uses. This application is in Council
7	Member Johnson's District. Land Use Number 482-488,
8	Lambert House Redevelopment. Applications submitted
9	by HPD and Phipps Houses for a series of actions
10	including a rezoning, UDAP designation, disposition
11	of city owned property, a zoning text amendment, a
12	zoning text amendment to apply to MIH Program, a
13	city map amendment, and two special permits. This
14	application is being modified to include the deep
15	affordability MIH option at 20 percent at 40 AMI.
16	This application is in Council Member Torres'
17	district. I want to congratulate him on this
18	project which is not only the largest affordable
19	housing development this committee has seen this
20	year at over 16 hundred units but also for the
21	commitment that Council Member Torres has secured
22	to build two desperately needed elementary schools
23	with close to a thousand new school seats. Nice
24	work, Council Member Torres. LU number 502 and 503
25	TMN904 Cluster, HTP seeks a, HPD seeks a UDAP

2	approval of four city owned buildings totaling 83
3	residential units and approval of a 20 year UDAP
4	tax exemption to preserve this units. The
5	application is in Council Member's Dickens
6	district. LU number 515, Lexington Gardens 2, an
7	application for rezoning, text amendment to apply
8	the MIH program, a special program to modify bulk
9	requirements, a special permit to modify parking
10	requirements, UDAP designation, disposition of city
11	owned property, an application for tax exemption to
12	facilitate approximately 400 unit affordable
13	housing development along Park Avenue. This
14	application is in the Speaker's district so we are
15	modifying this application to require that 25
16	percent at 60 AMI with 10 percent at 40 AMI MIH
17	requirement. LU Number 523, Fulton Houses, HPD is
18	seeking a property tax exemption in order to
19	facilitate an affordable housing project on an
20	existing parking lot of the NYCHA Fulton Housing
21	Development within the Chelsea neighborhood of
22	Manhattan. This proposed development will contain
23	168 affordable housing units with 8,000 square feet
24	of community space. This application is in Council
25	Member's Johnson's district IJI Number 526 and 527.

Melrose Commons North RFP Site B; HPD application
proposed amendment to an existing UDAP and tax
exemption to facilitate the development to 304
units of affordable rental housing in the Melrose
Commons Development in the Bronx. This application
is in Council Member's Salamanca's district. LU
Number 524, Valley Apartments. It's an application
submitted by HPD for the termination of a partial
tax exemption of the approval of a new real
property tax exemption. These actions will
facilitate the preservation of five multi-family
buildings totaling a 126 units of affordable
housing in Manhattan Valley neighborhood of
Manhattan in Council Member Levine's district. The
subcommittees have recommended approval of all
these items as have the council members whose
districts these projects are in. Do any members
have any questions or remarks? Hearing none, I will
ask the clerk to please call the roll.

The, the video is recording. We ask you to please explain your vote in great detail. Thank you.

COUNCIL MEMBER WILLIAMS: Thank you so much. I know everyone is waiting. I just want to say we are, as a body, pushing back on the homelessness that's in this city. We now know that we are going to have even more problems with the election. We anticipate a great number of problems with the election that occurred and so it seems to me that we should be doubling down on trying to get deeply affordable units. I know sometimes it is difficult in specific issues. I am going to continue my policy of abstaining on projects that do not have super extra low income particularly 30 or at least 40 percent of AMI. There is no way that we can be pushing back on the homelessness in this city without doing everything that we can and that includes the projects that come before us. So I am going to be abstaining on Land Use Numbers 523, 524 and voting age on all the rest.

CHAIRPERSON GREENFIELD: Thank you Council Member Williams for that eloquent explanation of your vote.

COMMITTEE CLERK MARTIN: Final vote in
today's Committee on Land Use. All items have been
adopted by a vote of 17 in the affirmative, zero in
the negative and no abstentions with the exceptions
of Land Use items 523 and 524 have been adopted by
a vote of 16 in the affirmative, zero in the
negative and one abstention. Thank you.
