Council Member Andy King. Currently New York City

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Law requires that property owners keep snow and other

9 material from accumulating near fire hydrants

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fronting their property. Proposed Intro 300A, if

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enacted, would clarify the bounds of this area by

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doing the following things: One: It would require

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the fire hydrant itself be cleared. Two: It would

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narrow the area around the fire hydrant to a size

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that corresponds to what the Fire Department needs to

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access the hydrant. And Three: It would remove the

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requirement that property owners actively clear snow

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and other material from the street itself. The bill

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also makes penalties for failing to clear snow from

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such area consistent with the penalties for failing

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to clear snow from a sidewalk. It also removes

criminal penalties for failing to remove snow and ice

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from a sidewalk. At this time, I'll turn it over to

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Council Member Andy King for a statement on his bill.

COUNCIL MEMBER KING: I want to thank you
Council Member Constantinides for filling in for our
Chair, Antonio Reynoso. I just want to urge the
Committee to vote yes on today's legislation Intro.
300. The purpose is just for safety. As we get into
the holiday season and the weather starts changing,
we just want people to be a little bit more
responsible to understand that fire hydrants aren't
one place that you should be dumping snow on. In any
given emergency actually Empanada Mama Restaurant
had a real challenge in early January 2016 because
the hydrants were covered with snow because
homeowners and owners thought it was a good idea to
dump snow on top of a fire hydrant, and sadly to say
apartments and store fronts were burnt down due to
the time loss uncovering the fire hydrants. So this
bill is about safety, it's about being practical and
being able to remove some of the harsh punishment,
but just adding a civil component to help us
understand that we are responsible for keeping New
York City safe. So all that being said, I'm asking
all my colleagues to vote yes on today's bill. Thank
you.
