15	The first, Intro 1117-A, introduced by
16	Council Member Van Bramer and myself, closes the
17	loophole for commercial cyclist safety requirements,
18	bringing independent contractors into the fold. As
19	more cyclists become riders for app [sic] service an
20	other tech companies, these cyclists should be looke
21	after and supported with important safety items, eve
22	if they are not currently classified employees.
23	The efforts to support bike courier
24	safety are important and I want to thank the advocac

of Bhairavi Desai and the Taxi Workers Alliance for

Intro 1177-A, introduced by Council

Member Rosenthal and myself, will require the DOT to study implementing a Barnes dance style crossing at some of the most dangerous intersections in New York

City. The study should consider the feasibility for this innovative street crossing that allows pedestrians to cross an intersection diagonally while no cars move in any direction. These crossings are popular in Japan and London and we have seen their effectiveness with a few we have here in New York

City. With no cars moving, the chance of someone being hit at an intersection plummets.

Finally, Intro 1285-A, introduced by myself, seeks to east crowding on our city's busy sidewalks. From 42nd Street near Times Square to 7th Avenue, between Penn Station and Times Square, to Main Street in Flushing, we know where our streets are overflowing and where needs for improvement are dire. It is unsafe to have pedestrians spilling into our streets as sidewalks brim with pedestrians; it was for this reason that the Times Square Pedestrian Plazas were such positive development and why I

commend the DOT for remaining street space. My bill will require DOT to study six of the most crowed sidewalks in our city and come up with a strategy to ease crowding.

In all, these bills aim to address serious safety concerns while making the flow of pedestrians more efficient.

Before we begin, I would like to offer Council Member Van Bramer an opportunity to speak on Intro 1117-A.

very much Mr. Chair for supporting this piece of legislation. I am very proud to continue the work that we are doing in the City of New York to make delivery cyclists safer as they perform their duties, while also making pedestrians and motorists safer. A few years ago we passed a bill that required a delivery cyclist to have reflective vests and I believe that has made the cyclists safer, as well as pedestrians and motorists; it also includes some information on the food establishment that they are delivering for, and that law has worked well and every time I see one of those bicycles with reflector vests on, I feel very, very proud. But there are

also hardworking folks who are delivering for entities like Uber Eats and others that are not subject to that initial law, so we are amending the law to make sure that those cyclists are safe and protected and cared for, as well as the pedestrians who come into contact with them. So it's an important addition to an important law that we've already passed and I thank the Chair and the Committee and the Council for their support.
