CHAIRPERSON GREENFIELD: Council Member Rose is here, we may begin. Good morning. Good morning, my name is David Greenfield I'm the Council Member from the 44th Council District in Brooklyn. I'm privileged to serve as the Chair of the Land Use Committee. Folks if we can get some guite on the set please. Thank you very much. I want to welcome my esteemed colleagues who are members of the committee in joining us today. I want to recognize that Council Member Gentile was the first to arrive and shall be the first to leave. I want to recognize Council Member Garodnick, Council Member Mendez, Chair Koo, Council Member Rose, Council Member Barron, Council Member Kohen, Council Member Kallos, Council Member Treyger, and Council... and Chair Salamanca. I want to thank Chair Salamanca, Chair Richards, and Chair Koo for their outstanding work on our Land Use Subcommittee so they will be voting to approve all the land use items in our calendar. The first two items on our calendar for a vote to approve our preconsidered LU's for the siting of two 332 seat Primary Schools both in Council Member Menchaca's district. These much-needed schools are located at

| 4525 8 th Avenue and 4302 4 th Avenue in Brooklyn. We'd |
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| also be voting to approve LU's 682 and 683, the |
| Whitlock and 165 th Street rezoning application in |
| Chair Salamanca's district. This application for a |
| rezoning to change existing M1-1 District to an R8A |
| slash C2-4 District and a zoning text amendment to |
| establish a Mandatory Inclusionary Housing are would |
| facilitate the development of two 14 story folks if |
| I can just ask if it's possible just to whisper, |
| thank you very much would facilitate the development |
| of two 14 story buildings with approximately 474 |
| units of affordable housing reserved for families |
| making between 30 and 80 percent of the area median |
| income. The two buildings would also contain |
| community facilities and commercial space. The next |
| item for approval is LU 684, the Lower Manhattan |
| Plaza Applicability Text Amendment for the property |
| in Council Member Chin's District. This application |
| would allow development sites in C6-4 Districts |
| within 50 feet of a designated retail street to take |
| advantage of a public plaza bonus provision. The next |
| item is also a text amendment. The next item is also |
| a text amendment to the zoning resolution LU 689. The |
| Section 93-122 text amendment would change the zoning |

| regulations applicable to a development site as |
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| Subarea 3 of the Special Hudson Yards District. The |
| change would allow for a building containing |
| residences to be developed prior to the minimum |
| amount of commercial floor area being developed for a |
| zoning lot of at least 55,000 square feet, no less |
| than 69,000 square feet. A portion of the zoning lot |
| would be reserved for the mandated commercial space. |
| The effected properties located in Council Member |
| Johnson's District. Lastly, we'll be voting to |
| approve LU 690, 704, and 705. LU 690, the Bedford |
| Arms Application is for a Private Housing Finance Law |
| Article XI tax exemption for a period of 40 years for |
| the 1350 Bedford Development in Council Member |
| Cumbo's District. The project was approved at our |
| last meeting. LU 704, the Habitat for Humanity Single |
| Family Home Phase 3. The project is an application |
| under the General Municipal Law for an UDAP project, |
| 20-year real property tax exemption and waiver of |
| area designation requirements and provisions of the |
| Charter for property in Council Member Miller |
| District in Queens. LU 705 is an application for 30- |
| year tax exemption under Article 11 to facilitate the |
| rehabilitation and preservation of property located |

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| at 233 Stuyvesant Avenue in Council Member Cornegie's |
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| District. All the Council Members in the local |
| districts are supportive of the applications I have |
| described. I'm actually going to come back to |
| questions and remarks in a minute and the Chair will |
| ask the Clerk to please ask Council Member Gentile |
| for his vote. |

CHAIRPERSON GREENFIELD: So, for the record we are now voting in accordance to the recommendations of Subcommittees to approve preconsidered LU's 20175217SCK and 20165647SCK and LU 682, 683, 684, 689, 690, 704, and 705. Do any members have any questions, do any members have any statements that they would like to make, Council Member Menchaca would you like to make a statement?

COUNCIL MEMBER MENCHACA: Yes.

CHAIRPERSON GREENFIELD: The Chair recognizes Council Member Menchaca to make a statement.

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COUNCIL MEMBER MENCHACA: Thank you Chair and to all the members of the committees. My, my statement is short but I want to underscore how important this is to Sunset Park and the incredible overcrowded crisis where schools are operating at an average of 120 percent over capacity. We have two new schools on the docket and I also want to recognize that we don't take this lightly at all as a city council when we look at landmarking... or landmarked buildings. We've heard the concerns and we will dedicate time and effort to build the relationships that need to be built between the preservation community, Sunset Park Community and the SCA to ensure that everybody who wants to be at the table can be at the table to discuss the future of these buildings I'm really excited for this work and I thank all of you and our community who has been spearheading this energy on the ground and really changing over the relationship with SCA to bring you schools. Over 20 percent of the schools that are getting built in the city right now are, are going to be built in Sunset Park, that's a direct relationship between the work that we're doing on the ground and connecting to government. That's how it should work

COUNCIL MEMBER KALLOS: I want to speak to one of the school sites in Council Member Menchaca's District, wanted to make it clear that I do have concerns about SCA or... sorry, the School Construction Authority or the ECF targeting landmarks throughout our city and using them as locations to get around the Landmarks Law which is there to protect these buildings and demolishing them in favor of schools, I, I favor schools, we need more schools. I want to acknowledge and thank Council Member Menchaca for preserving the historic façade around the building, I want to thank the School Construction Authority for agreeing to... coming back... come back to the Council Member and the Preservation Community with whether or not the full façade can be preserved because currently a portion of the façade is being excluded. I also want to note for the record that the School Construction Authority said that there are no other landmark sites being considered and that they do not plan to move forward with any others, this is

I think that as we talk about the homeless crisis and the expanding numbers of homeless people that we've got to do more to provide for housing for people who are homeless or people who are able to work but not able to pay the rent and this project is an M squared project which means half of this is for people who are making 100,000 dollars and the neighborhood median income in that area I believe is about 40 so we're involved our... we're putting ourselves in a situation, we're creating gentrification by providing housing for people who are not... who live in the community but are not able to afford. So, I'm voting no on 690.
