3 CHAIRPERSON FERRERAS-COPELAND: 4 afternoon and welcome to today's Finance Committee 5 hearing. My name is Julissa Ferreras-Copeland, I'm 6 the Chair of the committee. We've been joined by Minority Leader Matteo, Majority Leader Van Bramer, 8 Levine, Rodriguez, and Johnson. I know other members are going to be walking in as the hearing goes. Today 10 we have six items on the agenda; an Expense Budget 11 Modification, a Capital Budget Modification, a Pre-12 Considered Resolution, a Transparency Resolution, and 13 a Land Use Item and a Bid Item. Let's start with the 14 Budget Modification, the Expense Budget Modification 15 represents movement and the funding between and 16 within city agencies to reallocate appropriations in 17 city's Fiscal 2018 Expense Budget to fund City Council Local Initiatives as well as other 18 19 discretionary programs. The net fiscal impact of the 20 modification is zero. The Capital Budget Modification 21 reallocates appropriations that were reflected in the Fiscal 2018's Capital Budget to fund City Council 2.2 23 Initiatives. The net fiscal impact of this 24 modification is also zero. Next, we have a Pre-25 Considered Resolution that as per agreement with the

administration would rescind a term and condition
attached to units of appropriation 107 in the Fiscal
2018 budget of the Department of Social Services.
Next, we have a Transparency Resolution that sets
forth the new designation and changes in the
designation of certain organizations receiving local
and youth discretionary funding and funding pursuant
to certain initiatives in the budget. Organizations
appearing in the resolution that have not yet
completed the pre-qualification process conducted by
the Mayor's Office of Contract Services, the Council
or other entities are identified in the attached
chart with an asterisk. As with all Transparency
Resolutions Council Members will have to sign a
disclosure form indicating whether or not a conflict
exists with any of the groups on the attached list.
If a Council Member has a potential conflict of
interest with any of the organizations listed he or
she has the opportunity to disclose the conflict at
the time of their vote. As a reminder please disclose
any conflicts you may have with proposed
subcontractors used by organizations sponsored by
discretionary funding. These disclosures must be made
before the subcontractor can be approved, William

Grant from the General Counsel's Office is here and
can assist you with any questions or concerns
regarding the disclosures. Next, we have the Land Use
Item, Noonan Plaza in Council Member Gibson's
district in the Bronx. This property will receive a
partial 40-year property tax exemption to preserve
283 units of affordable housing through the city's
HDFC Program. Representatives from HPD are here to
answer any questions we may have on the Land Use
Item. Lastly, we have the Bid Item, Resolution 1639
set forth October $17^{th}$ , 2017 at ten a.m. in this room
as a date, time and place to hold a public hearing
considering the local law that would authorize an
increase in the budget of 11 bids. The budget
increase has been requested by property owners withir
the boundaries of each bid and would be used to
enhance the services provided. The 11 bids that are
seeking budget increases are the 34 <sup>th</sup> Street bid in
Council Member Johnson's district, the 82 <sup>nd</sup> Street
bid which sits in my district, Council Member and
Council Member Dromm's district, the Church Avenue
bid and the Flatbush bid which are both in Council
Member Eugene's district, the downtown Lower
Manhattan hid and the Soho Broadway hid which are

both in Council Member Chin's district, the Dumbo bio
in Council Member Levin Levin's district, the East
Mid-Manhattan bid and the Times Square bid which are
both in Council Member Garodnick's district [clears
throat] excuse me the Fordham Road bid in Council
Member Cabrera and Council Member Torres's district
and the Kings Highway bid in Council Member
Greenfield and Council Member Deutsch's district.
Each of these Council Members have submitted a letter
in support of the requested budget increase as more
information regarding the specific amounts of the
assessment increases and the reasons for the requests
can be found in the Committee Report prepared by the.
by NYTE's Division. Representatives from the Small
Business from the Department of Small Business
Services are here to answer any questions you may
have on the resolution. Are there any questions?
