CHAIRPERSON ROSENTHAL: [off mic] Good morning. [on mic] Do that that again. Good morning [gavel] and welcome to the Contracts Committee of the New York City Council. Today is October 26, 2017. My name is Helen Rosenthal, and I have the privilege of chairing this committee. Today's hearing provides this committee with an opportunity to vote in favor of a critical piece of legislation that closes the loophole, which could inadvertently result in a city agency to deny a person a public contracting opportunity based on their inclusion in a protected Introduction 1379-A sponsored by Council class. Member Ritchie Torres would make it unlawful for a city agency to deny a contract based on actual or perceived race, creed, color, national origin, age, gender, disability, sexual orientation, or alien nature or citizenship status of the owners of the bidder or a proposer. The bill would also enable a bidder or proposal who believes they have been discriminated against by a city agency to protest the agency's determination by rules established by the Procurement Policy Board. I commend Council Member Torres on his leadership in making sure that there is

3	our city's procurement process. For these reasons, I
4	am voting in favor of the bill before the committee
5	today, and I urge my fellow committee members to do
