schools are safe for all students, and staff. As a

former educator, I've seen first hand the physical,
emotional and psychological impact that bullying can
have on students. Because of social media bullying
has taken on new forms, and is likelier than ever to
spill out-out of the school campus and into the home
lives of students. In recent months, several New
Yorkers have tragically lost their lives because of
incidents rooted in bullying. My new bill, which was
actually introduced before the recent tragedies, is
designed to help us learn how bullying begins, where
bullying persists, whether or not schools have enough
resources and are currently utilizing them to deal
with it. My bill also examines how effectively
schools are ensuring parents are aware of bullying
incidents involving their children, and are involved
in the process every step of the way. Again, we need
to make sure that all of our students are safe and
respected at school. A big thanks to Chair Danny
Dromm, the outstanding staff-the committee staff of
the Education Committee, my colleagues for supporting
the bill. Chair Dromm is a co-sponsor as well as
Council Member Mark Levine, which requires schools to
report these bullying tactic-tactics. I also want to
give a shout-out and thanks to Chancellor Carmen
