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CHAIRPERSON CHIN: Good afternoon. name is Margaret Chin, Chair of the Committee on Aging. At today's hearing the committee will vote on two items. First, Proposed Intro No. 1185-A, a Local Law to amend the Administrative Code of the City of New York in relation to providing certain information to users of life-sustaining equipment and individuals for whom a disruption in electrical services would create a medical emergency. And second, Proposed Intro No. 1616-A, a Local Law in relation to establishing a temporary task force on postincarceration reentry for older adults. Proposed Intro 1185-A would require the Department for the Aging, DFTA, to regularly provide written materials from New York City Emergency Management to all senior centers and naturally occurring retirement communities, sponsored by DFTA on how to register with utility companies as users of life-sustaining medical equipment or for whom a disruption in electrical service would create a medical emergency. As we all know, in times of emergency our seniors are particularly vulnerable especially those who use certain medical equipment that require electricity or

have medical conditions that could worsen with a loss
of electricity. This bill will help provide
information for seniors on how they can register with
a utility company in order to be included in the
company's system emergency plan when power outage
occur. Proposed Intro 1616-A would created at
temporary task force focused specifically on post-
incarceration reentry for older adults. Seniors
returning to the City from state prisons and local
jails are faced—they face unique challenges and ofter
require reentry services to help them return to
civilian life. The task force would look at these
unique challenges and make recommendations to the
Mayor's Office of Criminal Justice or the Mayor's
designee on who would then issue a report regarding
among other things developing a compassionate post-
incarceration older adults reentry policy. In
closing, I would like to thank the staff that helped
shepherd these items to a vote, our Committee Counsel
Caitlin Fahey, our Policy Analyst Emily Rooney and
Dohini Sompura and Daniel Koop from the Finance
Division. I would urge my fellow colleagues—Council
Members to vote in support of Proposed Intro 1185-A
and 1616-A. We have been joined by our Senior Center

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COUNCIL MEMBER DEUTSCH: Thank you, Madam Today we're voting on Intro 1185, my bill to Chair. require the Department for the Aging to conduct outreach in multiple languages to educate seniors who rely on life sustaining equipment about how to register with the utility company. This information will be posted on the DFTA website as well as shared with senior centers and NORCs throughout the city. In case of a power outage registered individuals are given top priority for repairs and emergency are available—are immediately made aware of homes that may require a generator or transportation to a medical facility. In my district, which is both a waterfront community and made up of more than 30% seniors this is especially important. After Hurricane Sandy when phone lines were down, many were trapped in their homes without any means of alerting first responders to their location. Those who relied on medical equipment to help them breather were in
