and Council Member Vanessa Gibson. Resolution number 177 calls on the State to close a loop hole in the law that should not exist. Actually I feel it's ridiculous that we're here today even having to pass a resolution or have this discussion. New York is one of 35 states where consent may be used as a defense when a police officer is charged with raping a person in his or her custody. Anyone who has ever been in police custody knows that there is an undeniable power dynamic in every police encounter and as a civilian you understand that not going along with an officer's wishes could be potentially dangerous, if not detrimental to the outcome of the

encounter. Unfortunately, the September 2017
incident in Brooklyn involving two NYPD detectives
highlighted the need for us to make this very issue
clear in the law. There should be no defense of
consent as it applies to police officers and those in
their custody. Sexual contact between police
officers and those in their custody should be
prohibited full stop. Thank you to all the members
of the Public Safety Committee who are here today.
Promoting public safety in our City also means
supporting victims and for that reason I hope you
would join me today in voting for this resolution
calling on the state to amend the penal law to be
clear that individuals in police custody are
categorically incapable of consenting to sexual
conduct with a police officer. We've now been joined
by Council Member Williams as well. We will now ask
our Committee clerk to call the roll and begin the
vote and if people have statements they want to put
on the record, we will give you that moment so I will
ask the Council to call the roll.
