CHAIRPERSON SALAMANCA: Alright. Good morning, everyone. Welcome to the Land Use Committee. I am Council Member Rafael Salamanca, Chair of this committee. I want to welcome my colleagues who are members of the committee. We have Council Members Gibson, Constantinides, Koo, Reynoso, Torres, Grodenchik, Chair Adams, Diaz, Chair Moya and Rivera, and—and—and the—the and Chair Deutsch, temporary Chair Deutsch.

COUNCIL MEMBER DEUTSCH: Right.

CHAIRPERSON SALAMANCA: I also want to recognize and welcome back Mr. Antonio Reynoso from paternity leave. Welcome back. [applause] Alright. I want to thank Chair Moya, Chair Adams and Acting Chair Deutsch for their work on our Land Use Subcommittees yesterday. Today we'll be voting to approve LU 20, the landmark designation of 827-831 Broadway Buildings, the buildings located in Council Member Rivera's district is in Manhattan are twin Civil War Era marble palaces notable for their architecture, but which also gained cultural significance after World War II due to their occupancy by prominent artists of that era. We'll be

2 voting to approve LU 26, a landmark Designation of the Interborough Rapid Transit Company Powerhouse 3 located at 855-869 Eleventh Avenue in Council Member 4 Rosenthal's district in Manhattan. The Powerhouse 5 opened in 1904 to power that IRT Subway, and was the 6 7 largest generating station constructed at the time. It's-it represents a unique innovation of 20th 8 Century engineering, and classic architecture 9 expression. We'll be voting to approve LU 27, a 10 landmark designation of the Empire State Dairy 11 12 Company Buildings at 2840 Atlantic Avenue in Council 13 Member Espinal's district in Brooklyn. The buildings 14 are a former dairy production facility designated in 15 the early 1900s. We will be voting to approve with 16 modifications LU 28 and 29, the 35-10 Astoria 17 Boulevard rezoning in Council Member Constantinides' 18 District in Queens. The zoning map amending will rezone the project area from R6B District to C4-3 19 20 district, and the zoning text amendment would map the project area and Mandatory Inclusionary Housing, 21 2.2 utilizing Options 1 and 2. We are voting to modify 23 the text amendment to strike Option 1 to ensure that a greater number of affordable units are created as 24 required by Option 2. These actions will facilitate 25

the development of a new 7-story mixed-use building
in which approximately 11 of the 35 apartments will
be affordable. Are there any questions or remarks on
these applications? Alright, seeing none, I will
call a vote in accordance with recommendations of the
subcommittees, and with the support of local Council
members to approve LUs 20, 26 and 27, and to approve
with modifications, I have described LUs 28 and 29.
