CHAIRPERSON SALAMANCA: Alright, good morning everyone. I am Rafael Salamanca, Chair of the Land Use Committee. I want to thank Chair Moya, Chair Adams and Chair Kallos for their work on our-on our Land Use Committee Subcommittee. Today we'll be voting to approve the Spofford Campus Redevelopment Application also know as the Peninsula. These five related actions, LUs 31 to 35 will facilitate the redevelopment of the former Spofford Juvenile Detention Center into a five-building mixed-use project with approximately 740 units of 100% affordable housing and light industrial, commercial community facility uses in the Hunts Point neighborhood in my Council district. Today, we will be-also be voting to approve LUs 39 and 40 to much needed primary schools in Council Member Van Bramer's district in Queens. We'll be voting to disapprove LUs 21 and 22, individual landmark designations for single-family homes in Council Member Gjonaj's district in City Island in the Bronx. Council Member Gjonaj disagrees with that assessment of the LPC in that he does not believe that the architectural and historical merits of these buildings warrant

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designation. As compared to the burdens of landmark designations on single-family homeowners. Prior to the Subcommittee vote the Subcommittee and Land Use staff worked with Council Member Gjonaj's office to arrange additional conversions between LPC and the owners of these two homes who are opposed to landmark designation. The committee is aware that LPC staff is often able to sure owners that designation is not as burdensome as it is perceived to be. LPC typically explains that it can provide valuable technical resources and refer owners to other resources such as foundations providing financial assistance. Unfortunately, direct conversations between LPC and these owners have now come to fruition in accordance with the recommendations of the Subcommittee. We'll be voting to disapprove these items. Are there any questions or remarks from members of the Subcommittee? No. Well, I would like to very quickly just speak briefly on this project in my district, the Spofford project. As many of you know, my district the South Bronx is home to-we were home to three jails in my Council District, and in 2011, the ACS decided to close Spofford, which was a dark moment in our community's life for over 50

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years, which was a juvenile detention center. I've been working on this project since 2013, and I want to give shout-out to City Planning, Charlie Samboy and to Ismenias Philiotis (sp?) from MHANY Management. We've been working on this project since 2013, and to know that we've been able to take this piece of land and create 740 units of 100% affordable housing have a homeless set-aside and ranging from 30% AMI to up 90% AMI, to know that we were able to extend the affordability from 40 years to 60 years to know that we were able to add what's call a full incubator to this project. So, anyone that has a business in the community whether their building case or they're doing some type of jars, and they're doing this at home, they have a-there's the space in-in this location, 2,000 to about 2,500 square feet where they can go, and it's a start-up business, a start-up space for their business. To know that there's athere something called a Peninsula. I was Peninsula alumni when I was in pre-K in the community. It's been there for over 50 years, and to know that they're going to be able to build out their own space is very rewarding. To know that this project will include labor. The laborers will be there to do the

2 demolition. You know, there's been many conversations about affordable housing, and is it 3 4 really affordable to bring in labor? I've always begged to differ that there should be conversations 5 and there should be negotiations in which labor can 6 7 be part of these projects, and labor is going to be part of this project. So, I'm really excited about 8 There's also going to be a training component 9 where we're going to take residents from the 10 community, and they are going to learn on-site job 11 12 skills and get an opportunity to join into some of these labor organizations. There's going to be open 13 14 space where the rec center right behind there's going 15 to be 14,000 new green space that's going to be 16 added, and I got commitments from the-from the 17 developer that they will-they will redo the sidewalks 18 on 100-year-old monastery that's right next to this project. I'm really excited about this project, and 19 20 I really urge my colleagues to vote in favor of this. [background comments, pause] Alright, and then last 21 2.2 we'll be voting to holding a public hearing later 23 today on Preconsidered LU Application No. 180239 PXX admitted to the Department of Citywide Administrative 24 Services pursuant to 195 of the New York City Charter 25

2 for a notice of intent to acquire office space for the Taxi and Limousine Commission in a building 3 located at 188 West 230<sup>th</sup> Street Block 3264, Lot 104, 4 Borough of the Bronx, Community Board 8, District 14. 5 This item was not on Landmark Subcommittee regular 6 7 calendar, Rules 11.30 of the Council Rules provides that in order for the Subcommittee to hold a public 8 hearing on a matter that's not included in our 9 calendar. Two-thirds of-two-thirds of the Land Use 10 Committee or Subcommittee must vote to add the matter 11 12 to the calendar for today's 1:15 Subcommittee meeting. So, with that, are there any comments or 13 questions from members the Committee? No. So with 14 15 that, are there any comments or questions from members of the committee? No. Seeing none, I will 16 17 now call a vote in accordance with recommendations of 18 the Subcommittees and with the support of the local members to approve LUs 31 to 35, 39, and 40 to 19 20 disapprove LUs 21 and 22 and to add pre-LU Taxi and Limousine office space to the Landmarks Subcommittee 21 2.2 calendar. We will be taking one vote on all the 23 items together. A vote of a-of-of yes is a vote to approve the Spofford Campus Redevelopment and 24 Peninsula, and the two schools and to disapprove the 25
