I'm joined by my 6 colleagues, Council Members Cabrera and Brannon. We 7 are here today to vote on a package of bills that aim 8 to minimize the risk of residential fires and educate the public on important fire safety information. 10 Included in the package in today, are the following 11 bills; Proposed Intro 599-A, sponsored by Speaker 12 Corey Johnson. Which requires the Fire Department to 13 conduct targeted outreach through residential 14 building owners and residents regarding existing fire 15 safety requirements and education. Proposed Intro 16 603-A, sponsored by Council Member Constantinides. 17 Which requires the Fire Department to conduct fire 18 hydrant inspections at least twice per year. And 19 requires the DEP to report on the findings of such 20 inspections. And finally, Proposed Intro 608-A, and 21 609-A, sponsored by Council Member Torres. Which 22 respectively require that multifamily building owners 23 place notice in such buildings, advising tenants of 24 the importance of closing doors during a fire 25 emergency, and in an effort to contain the spread of
