### Int. No. 1018

By Council Members Levine, Chin, Constantinides, Mendez, Richards, Rodriguez and Rosenthal  
A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to bulletproof vests used by the New York city police department.

#### Be it enacted by the Council as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 1 of title 10 of the administrative code of the city of New York is amended by adding a new section 10-172 to read as follows:

§ 10-172 Bulletproof vests. The department shall only utilize bulletproof vests that are:

- Covered by their manufacturer's warranty;
- Have not been in use for more than five years;
- Have not been struck by any projectile from a firearm, or any similar projectile;
- Fit their user properly in such a manner that they provide the protection for which they were designed;
- Meet the standard for ballistic resistance classification IIIA as determined by the national institute of justice or any successor national institute of justice standard; and

f. Are not damaged in any other way that would substantially affect performance;

§2. This local law takes effect 6 months after it becomes law.
