A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to requiring owners to provide notice to their tenants regarding procedures that should be followed when a gas leak is suspected

Section 1. Section 27-2005 of the administrative code of the city of New York is amended by adding a

new subsection f to read as follows:

f. The owner of a dwelling shall deliver or cause to be delivered to each tenant and prospective tenant of

such dwelling, along with the lease or lease renewal form for such tenant or prospective tenant, and shall post

and maintain in a common area of the building containing such dwelling, a notice, in a form developed or

approved by the department, regarding the procedures that should be followed when a gas leak is suspected.

Such notice may be combined with any existing required notices and shall instruct tenants to first call 911 and

then call the relevant gas service provider, whose name and emergency phone number shall be set forth on such

notice, before contacting such owner or an agent thereof when a gas leak is suspected.

§ 2. This local law takes effect 180 days after it becomes law, except that the commissioner of housing

preservation and development may take such measures as are necessary for its implementation, including the

promulgation of rules, before such effective date.
