At today's hearing, the Committee will be voting on a bill sponsored by Council Member

Salamanca that will provide greater accountability for certain City employees whose jobs require them to question members of the public. New Yorkers interact with City employees every day. Often, those employees, particularly the employees who have the ability to issue a summons or notice of violation,

are required to question individuals as part of their jobs. While most of the time this questioning occurs without a problem, often there will be times when it does not. In those circumstances, it is essential that members of the public know who they're being questioned by and how to contact them so that they may resolve any issues that arise during the questioning. Currently, only members of the NYPD are required to identify themselves. It is important that we introduce the same accountability and transparency to the myriad of other agencies that also interact with the public. The bill we are hearing today, Intro. 743-A, will increase the accountability and transparency by requiring City employees who can issue a summons or notice of violation to identify themselves during encounters with the public. They would be required to provide preprinted, handwritten, or electronic business card with identifying information upon request. If a business card is not available, employees could instead provide the identifying information verbally. The business card should include the employee's name and agency, a telephone number and an email address that can be used to contact the agency. Employees who engage in
