Zoom, and Marjorie Velázquez and Nantasha Williams in

the cheap seats.

Today, the Committee will be voting on the following items, Intro. 1208 and a Transparency Resolution.

First, Intro. 1208 sponsored by Deputy

Speaker Ayala would extend the current rate of 5.875

percent for the additional tax on the occupancy of

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hotel rooms through November 30, 2027, to maintain the status quo. It's estimated by the Council Finance Division that the tax if extended at the current rate beyond November 30, 2023, would generate approximately 50 million dollars in FY-24 and approximately 99 million in FY-25.

Lastly, Transparency Resolution sets

forth the new designation in changes and the

designation of certain organizations receiving local

aging and youth discretionary funding and funding

pursuant to certain initiatives in the budget. As

with all Transparency Resolutions, Council Members

will have to sign a disclosure form indicating

whether or not a conflict exists with any of the

groups on the attached list.

If any Council Member has a potential conflict of interest with any of the organizations listed, they have the opportunity to disclose the conflict at the time of their vote.
