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SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Good morning, and welcome to today's New York City Council hearing for the Committee on Governmental Operations, State, and Federal Legislation.

CHAIRPERSON RESTLER: Thanks so much. Good morning. My name's Lincoln Restler, and I am the Chair of the Committee of Governmental Operations, State and Federal Legislation, which never is not a mouthful. I'd like to start off by thanking those of you who are joining us today, especially my Colleagues. We have Council Member Jim Gennaro on Zoom, good to see you, Jim, Council Member Gale Brewer, Council Member Shahana Hanif, Council Member David Carr, and Council Member Jennifer Gutiérrez.

Today, we'll be voting on eight State Legislative Resolutions, also known as Home Rules or SLRs, in support of various pieces of state legislation.

Resolutions deals with an issue that many of my
Colleagues hear about from our constituents on a
regular basis, abandoned vehicles. They impact the
quality of life of our communities by taking up
parking spaces and counteracting the work neighbors
do to keep our streets clean and safe. I hope the New
York State Legislature will pass this legislation
introduced by Senator Robert Jackson and Assembly
Member Jaime Williams to expand the number of
abandoned vehicles that the City is able to remove.

Another bill that I'd like to specifically address has been introduced by Senator Leroy Comrie and Assembly Member Clyde Vanel. This legislation increases fines for tractor trailers that park on residential streets overnight. The current fines do not adequately disincentivize semi-truck drivers from using our residential streets as parking lots. Increasing the fines will lead to cleaner air, fewer disruptions, and a better quality of life for New Yorkers whose neighborhoods are near a highway. I know that Council Member Kevin Riley will be very happy that we are passing this Home Rule Message.

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The other SLRs we will vote on today cover a variety of issue areas including retirement, disability, and pension benefits for various City employees, and the use of land in the South Bronx to facilitate Metro North access to Penn Station, a really exciting public transit project.

I believe the Council and Albany working together to pass these SLRs would greatly benefit our City and lead to the betterment of the lives of many New Yorkers.

I'd like to especially thank the Council
Staff who worked on this, our Intergovernmental
Affairs Division led by Carlos Beato and his team,
Santa Soriano-Vasquez and Rick Arbello, did a
terrific job, and our Committee Staff as always,
Jayasri Ganapathy and Erica Cohen, for all of their
hard work, as well as my Team for their help and
assistance as well.
