## 2 CHAIRPERSON RIVERA: Good

afternoon, ladies and gentlemen. My name is Joel Rivera, Chair of the Health Committee here in the City Council. We are here today to vote on Intro 818-A, sponsored by Council Member Jessica Lappin. Intro 818-A is a local law that would require food service establishments to put up posters with information for workers on food allergies. The committee previously conducted a hearing on this legislation on January 29, 2009.

Throughout the United States it is estimated that approximately 12 million people suffer from food allergies, accounting for about 1 out of every 25 Americans. A person's reaction to a food allergy can vary greatly from mild irritation to a potentially fatal reaction. Every year food allergies result in 30,000 hospital visits, 2,000 hospitalizations and 150 deaths. Food allergies are a serious public health concern for which there is no cure.

Individuals who suffer from food allergies are particularly vulnerable when visiting restaurants. They no longer have direct control over the food they eat and are relying on

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the staff paying specific attention to their needs. Severe allergic reactions made be triggered by the mere cross contact between one's food and an allergen. More than 130 million people are served each day in restaurants across our country. In New York City there are more than 25,000 food service establishments.

To avoid severe reactions to food allergies, communication is imperative between the customer and the restaurant staff. Additionally, education can go a long way toward preventing an incident before it occurs. Council Member Lappin's legislation would require food allergy posters to be displayed in food service establishments. To ensure that staff is aware of this critical safety issue the poster would need to be visible to staff members who are involved in both the preparation and the service of food.

Education along with the active communication between the patron and the restaurant staff are the primary methods to ensure that when individuals eat out they have both an enjoyable and safe experience.

11	we have to look at just how much we're going to
