CHAIRPERSON RILEY: [GAVEL] Good

afternoon, and welcome to a meeting of the

Subcommittee on Zoning and Franchises. I am Council

Member Kevin Riley, Chair of the Subcommittee, and I

am joined today by Council Member Abreu, Hanks,

Schulman, Carr, Sanchez, and remotely by Council

Member Moya.

Today, we are scheduled to hold one public hearing regarding the Kingsbridge Armory ESDC grant application by the New York City Economic

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Development Corporation followed by a vote on this application.

I will now go over the hearing procedures. This meeting is being held in a hybrid format. Members of the public who wish to testify may testify in person or through Zoom. Members of the public wishing to testify remotely may register by visiting the New York City Council's website at www.council.nyc.gov. To sign up, or for those of you here in person, please see one of the Sergeant-at-Arms to prepare and submit a speaker's card.

Members of the public may also view a live streamed broadcast of this meeting at the Council's website.

When you are called to testify before the Subcommittee, if you are joining us remotely, you will remain muted until recognized by myself to speak. When you are recognized, your microphone will be unmuted.

We will limit public testimony to two minutes per witness. If you have additional testimony you would like the Subcommittee to consider, or if you have written testimony you would like the Subcommittee to consider, instead of appearing in

Lastly, for everyone attending today's meeting, this is a government proceeding and decorum must be observed at all times. Members of the public are asked not to speak during the meeting unless you are testifying.

The witness table is reserved for people who are called to testify, and no video recording or photography is allowed from the witness table.

Further, members of the public may not present audio or video recording as testimony but may submit transcripts of such recordings to the Sergeant-at-Arms for inclusion in the hearing record.

I will now open up the public hearing on pre-considered LU related to the application by the New York City Economic Development Corporation for a grant to the New York State Empire State Development

5 application concerns Kingsbridge Armory in the Bronx

6 and Council Member Sanchez's District. Through the

7 Restore New York grant program, municipalities can

8 seek financial assistance for the revitalization of

9 commercial and residential properties. The program

10 encourages community development and neighborhood

11 growth through the demolition, rehabilitation, and or

12 reconstruction of vacant, abandoned, condemned, or

13 | surplus properties.

I would now like to give the floor to Council Member Sanchez to give her statement. Council Member Sanchez.

2 COUNCIL MEMBER SANCHEZ: Thank you so 3 much, Chair Riley, and good morning, everyone. I'm

4 Council Member Sanchez, and I represent the

5 Kingsbridge Armory and just wanted to share these

6 points.

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The Kingsbridge Armory has been functionally vacant for over 25 years. We have over 500,000 square feet of pure potential in this space built in 1917. It's been used over the years as a military hub, imagine 10,000 soldiers there at the height of World War II, it's been used as a concert venue, it was used as a food distribution hub during COVID-19, and the list goes on. It is said to be the largest armory in the world. The Kingsbridge Armory represents the vast potential of our community. With EDC and the community working group when I took office, we led a nine-month community engagement process that reached over 4,000 Bronx sites and culminated in a community vision plan in December of 2023. Throughout this year, 2024, EDC has been reviewing responses to its RFP and is still in the process of selecting a development team. Today's Resolution is about setting up any future effort for financial success. I want to be clear that today's

MICHELLE LAMBERTI: Thank you. Good
morning, Chair Riley and Members of the Subcommittee
on Zoning and Franchises. My name is Michelle
Lamberti, and I serve as Vice President of
Legislative Affairs in the Government and Community
Relations Department of the New York City Economic
Development Corporation, and I'm joined by my
colleague, Vice President Jana Pohorelsky.

The New York City Economic Development

Corporation works to create a vibrant, inclusive, and globally competitive economy for all New Yorkers. Our work is guided by four strategic priorities, strengthening business confidence, growing innovation industries with a focus on equity, building neighborhoods as places to live, learn, work, and play, and delivering sustainable infrastructure.

Pursuant to the New York State Urban

Development Act, the City intends to file an

application for the Empire State Development

information sessions, and feedback from over 75

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industry stakeholders. The Together for Kingsbridge Vision Plan reflects the community's values, ideas, and perspectives, all of which we heard clearly during the engagement process. The City released the plan in August 2023, and together with the release of the subsequent Request for Proposals on September 22, 2023, sought proposals from qualified parties for the unique opportunity to redevelop and operate the Armory and accomplish the City's goals of creating a financially feasible, thriving mixed-use development that would reflect the guiding principles set forth in the Vision Plan. We're excited about the robust engagement process done in partnership with the community, which has generated many great proposals for this amazing asset, an asset which will need all the investment it can get. We look forward to the public announcement of a developer and working with Council to bring a project through the ULURP process.

The Kingsbridge Armory is a historic military facility located in the heart of the Kingsbridge Heights neighborhood of the Bronx and is one of the few remaining armories in the city. The Armory was constructed in 1917, and much of the building is in its original condition. The Armory

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lacks essential building systems, including plumbing, HVAC, life and fire safety, and does not have adequate electrical service and lighting. Based on previous studies, it is known there are hazardous materials located throughout the Armory. The building envelope is not watertight, the roof is past its useful life, and the windows are damaged and do not adhere to current New York City energy standards. I say this all to point out that there is extensive work that's needed just to bring this building into good standing, and we need every available dollar to do so. Restore New York funding, if granted, would be used to address these critical infrastructure needs at the Armory. As you know, the City and State have committed 216 million dollars to benefit the redevelopment of the Armory by funding critical infrastructure needs that will leverage the maximum private investment while also supporting the community's goals identified through the ongoing engagement process. Any public investments in the building will help to support the realization of the goals included in the Vision Plan.

As you know, redevelopment of the Armory is a massive undertaking with significant financial

2 | needs. We're leaving no stone unturned as we look to

3 secure as many grants and funding opportunities as

4 possible to advance this project. Under the proposed

5 application, the City will apply for 2 million

6 dollars to facilitate the renovation and adaptive

7 reuse of the Kingsbridge Armory, an existing landmark

8 | building of approximately 588,000 gross square feet

9 that is currently vacant. Redevelopment of the

10 Kingsbridge Armory is a special opportunity to

11 | transform an awe-inspiring landmark into a place that

12 is catalytic for economic development for the

13 | community, the Borough, the City, and the Region.

Consistent with guidelines issued by the

15 | Empire State Development Corporation, the City

16 respectfully requests that the Council make the

17 | following findings related to New York City's

18 | application for funding this project under the

19 Restore New York Grant.

20 1. The proposed project is consistent

21 | with the Municipality's Local Revitalization or Urban

22 Development Plan.

23 2. The proposed financing is appropriate

24 | for this specific project.

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- 3. The project facilitates effective and efficient use of existing and future public resources so as to promote both economic development and preservation of community resources.
- 4. The project develops and enhances infrastructure and or other facilities in a manner that will attract, create, and sustain employment opportunities where applicable.

Thank you, Chair Riley and Members of the Subcommittee, for your time and consideration.

CHAIRPERSON RILEY: Thank you so much. I just have three questions real quick and I'm going to see if Council Member Sanchez has any questions.

I understand that you're talking about a future project that hasn't yet been announced. What can you tell us today about how this funding might be used on this project?

MICHELLE LAMBERTI: Sure. Thank you for the question, Council Member. So, I think, as I mentioned, we are looking forward to making a public announcement about the project soon. I would point to, as I mentioned in my testimony, the Armory has a lot of existing really critical infrastructure needs that will need to be addressed irrespective of what

project comes before you and we move forward with.

Some of those are like the plumbing in the HVAC

system, adequate electrical. Some of you might know

about the persistent flooding problem at the Armory.

So, there is a lot that needs to be done. The 2

million dollars can be used towards renovation and

MICHELLE LAMBERTI: I mean, I think we are committed to seeing this project as a success for the City, and so we would be thoroughly disappointed because we think it's a really great project for the state to be putting money towards, but we would continue to look for additional funding efforts to make sure that this project comes to fruition.

CHAIRPERSON RILEY: In the context of the Kingsbridge Vision Plan, is there anything you can share with us regarding future steps in terms of community outreach?

JANA POHORELSKY: Sure, I can take that.

In terms of the next steps on community outreach, the process that we would go through is the public approvals process so environmental review and ULURP, and so, of course, we'll be back in front of the Committee to discuss those steps but, as the Council Member mentioned, we spoke with over 4,000 residents in the process that led to the development of that Vision Plan. The Vision Plan has been a key guiding document in our review of proposals for the future developer, and so we're excited to continue outreach and seek additional engagement from the community as we move through the public approvals process.

CHAIRPERSON RILEY: Thank you. That's the end of my questioning.

Council Member Sanchez, do you have any questions?

COUNCIL MEMBER SANCHEZ: Yeah, thank you, Chair Riley. I just did want to highlight for

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2 Colleagues that this is a very expensive

3 redevelopment, as EDC has mentioned, but we do have

4 200 million dollars secured, 100 million committed

5 from the State and 100 million committed from the

6 City, and the City Council, we have put in nearly 15

7 | million dollars at this point together with the

8 Borough President, so we have the strongest

9 | foundation that we've ever had for an attempt to

10 redevelop the Kingsbridge Armory, but it's very

11 | expensive and we need more so it's very important to

12 be able to secure these funds.

I guess my question for EDC would be, do you have an estimate that you could share at this stage of, you know, what total development costs could look like at this stage, at this time around and, if you don't have an estimate because projects that have been proposed have been so different, could you tell us what the total development cost was estimated to be in the last redevelopment proposal for the ice skating rinks?
