Department to submit an annual report on how to

4 located in environmental justice areas and include a

5 list of at least 15 school playgrounds each year that

6 could be opened for use to the public on weekends and

7 after school. A great idea and a very easy way to

expand access to green space for all of our New

Intro. 643-A would require the Parks
Department and DOE to post information on its
websites on how to access DOE indoor basketball
courts when the weather does not allow for the use of
outdoor basketball courts. The bill would also
require Parks with DOE to conduct a study on how to
improve overall access to indoor basketball courts
including an evaluation of how to improve the
efficiency of the permitting process for indoor
basketball courts and the feasibility of allowing
members of the public to use DOE indoor courts on bad
weather days during times when school is not in
session.

These bills were first considered at a hearing held by this Committee on April 23rd. Both of these bills further an important goal of this
