Today's 4 date is November 12, 2025, recorded by Walter Lewis 5 in HR2. 6 SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Good morning, and 7 welcome to today's New York City Council vote for the 8 Committee on Sanitation and Solid Waste Management. 9 Please silence all cell phone and electronic devices. 10 11 Chair, we're ready to begin. 12 CHAIRPERSON ABREU: Good morning, 13 everyone, and welcome to today's hearing hosted by 14 the Committee on Sanitation. 15 To minimize disruption, please place 16 electronic devices on vibrate or silent mode. 17 The purpose of this hearing is to hold a 18 vote on Proposed Intro. Number 1123-B, sponsored by 19 Council Member Crystal Hudson. The Committee 20 previously heard Introduction Number 1123 at a 21 hearing on November 20, 2024, where it received testimony from representatives of the Department of 2.2 23 Sanitation and interested members of the public. 24 Already with the pilot program for on-street

containerization that started earlier this year in

COMMITTEE ON SANITATION AND SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT 3 West Harlem, the streets are much cleaner and rat sightings have decreased significantly. No longer are there piles of black trash bags on the sidewalk with rats scurrying amongst them that have been part of New Yorkers' daily lives for as long as many of us can remember. This bill is a huge step in expanding that success citywide, and it will transform our cityscape for decades to come. Having our trash in clean containers instead of strewn about outside of our apartment buildings would be a huge win for sanitation, for public health, and for sightliness. This is one of those rare moments when we actually change what New York looks and feels like on the ground, when we treat trash as something that must be managed as part of our public space. By finally taking waste management seriously and joining the 21st century standards that cities like Barcelona, Amsterdam, and Milan have already adopted, we are drawing a hard line between the old New York of black bags and the modern city we expect to be. The Department of Sanitation is in the process of rolling out a program to require all residential buildings with 31 or more dwelling units to place waste in Empire bins, which are stationary on-street

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COMMITTEE ON SANITATION AND SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT 4 containers placed in the parking lane by the City and assigned to a specific property solely for the use of that property. Under that program, medium-sized buildings with 10 to 30 units would be permitted to opt into the use of Empire bins. The program has been piloted in Manhattan Community District 9, and another pilot is rolling out in Brooklyn Community District 2. A citywide version of the program is currently undergoing environmental review and is expected to be implemented by 2032. Proposed Intro. 1123-B would provide authorizations for and place restrictions on any Department of Sanitation program requiring residential buildings to place refuse in stationary on-street containers. Specifically, DSNY would only be permitted to require buildings with 10 or more units to use on-street containers, although smaller buildings could be required to share onstreet containers. Any building with 10 or more units that uses the on-street containers would be required to provide it to its employees with relevant training and personal protective equipment. The bill would authorize DSNY to impose an annual fee of 55 dollars per unit on buildings with 10 or more units that use

3	waived for certain affordable housing developments.
