Today we have before us two candidates for 2 Oddo. 3 appointment to the City Planning Commission. Thev 4 are Karen Phillips, a resident of Manhattan, a candidate for reappointment by the Public Advocate 5 to the Planning Commission. If the Council gives 6 7 its advice and consent, Ms. Phillips will serve 8 the remainder of a five-year term that expires on June 30th, 2010. And Rayann Besser, a resident of 9 10 Staten Island, is a candidate for appointment by 11 the Staten Island Borough President to the 12 Planning Commission. If the Counsel gives its advice and consent, Ms. Besser will replace John 13 Morolo, and serve the remainder of a five-year 14 15 term that expires on June 30th, 2011. The City Planning Commission has 13 members, seven 16 17 appointed by the Mayor, one by the Public Advocate and one by each of the Borough Presidents. 18 19 planning commission is responsible for the long 20 range planning to ensure orderly growth and 21 development, assist in developing the ten-year 22 capital plan, prepares and modifies the zoning 23 resolution among a number of other critical functions. Commission Members serve five-year 24 25 terms. There is no limitation on the number of

KAREN PHILLIPS: I just would like to thank the Committee and the Counsel for giving me the privilege for the past five years of serving on the New York City Planning Commission.

My experience and background prepared me to play this role for the citizens of the City of New York City. And the leadership of the Public Advocate

Most of all I personally know 18 19 Karen; she is my constituent. She has been a 20 tremendous resource to me and to my office. I am 21 proud to call her a colleague and a friend, and 22 for these reasons I stand beside Karen and 23 strongly support her for this position. I ask my 24 colleagues for their support and thank the chair 25 for this time.
