CHAIRPERSON AYALA: (GAVEL SOUND) (GAVELING IN)

Thank you. Good morning, everyone, and welcome to today's hearing. My name is Diana Ayala, and I am the Deputy Speaker of the New York City Council and the Chair of the General Welfare Committee.

Today, our committee will be voting on two resolutions:

Proposed Resolution Number 41-A, sponsored by Council Member Alexa Avilés, calling on the New York State Legislature to pass, and the Governor to sign,

2 S.2082/A.3474 to create the New York State Working
3 Families Tax Credit.

And Proposed Resolution 57-A, which I have sponsored, calling on New York state to create a program to provide food benefits for those not eligible for existing benefits, including anyone over 55 meeting income eligibility.

Over one million New Yorkers are food insecure.

However, around 40% of food insecure New Yorkers have incomes too high to be eligible for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program.

Proposed Resolution 57-A calls on the State to create a program to support these food insecure New Yorkers who are excluded from federal benefits.

Research has shown that reducing food insecurity has a profound and positive impact on the health of recipients. And decreasing food insecurity would decrease the State's health care burden and improve the well-being of the most vulnerable New Yorkers.

I would now like to call on Council Member Avilés to deliver a statement on her resolution.

COUNCIL MEMBER AVILÉS: Thank you so much. Thank you, Chair Ayala, as well as cosponsors on Resolution 41, for your support. And I also would like to thank Senator Gounardes for centering working families at the state level.

Resolution 41 is near and dear to our hearts in our work to try to reverse childhood poverty trends that have impacted not only my district, but New York City. Through this legislation, we'll have an opportunity, where the federal government has failed, by increasing support to those families most in need. So under this legislation, tax benefits would be offered to families with children through the age of 17.
