13 CHAIRPERSON DE LA ROSA: Thank you. 14 [GAVEL] Good morning, and welcome to today's vote of 15 the Civil Service and Labor Committee. I'm Council 16 Member Carmen De La Rosa, Chair of the Committee.

Chair, we're ready to begin.

17 Resolution 598, sponsored by myself, 18 calls on the New York City healthcare institutions to 19 contract only with industrial laundry companies that 20 respect workers' legal rights and uphold local 21 standards for wages and benefits. This is not just 2.2 about laundry service. It's about whether we as a 23 City will allow public dollars and institutional 24 contracts to support companies that repeatedly violate labor laws, endangering workers and 25

2	undermining collective bargaining. The facts are
3	clear. Companies like FDR Services Corp have engaged
4	in a pattern of unsafe and unlawful practices, from
5	serious OSHA violations to retaliation against
6	workers for taking sick leave during the pandemic.
7	These actions are not just morally unacceptable; they
8	are incompatible with our City's values of dignity,
9	fairness and respect for workers. Most laundry
10	contractors in the industry do the right thing. They
11	pay fair wages, they provide health benefits and they
12	follow the law. This resolution is about ensuring
13	that all contractors follow this example. It's about
14	using our collective voice to say that we will not
15	turn a blind eye to abuse or allow public
16	institutions to reward bad actors. We stand with
17	immigrant women who keep up the backbone of this
18	industry, we stand with workers fighting for decent
19	conditions, and we stand for the principle that
20	respect for labor rights is not optional in our city.
21	I urge my Colleagues to vote yes on this resolution.
22	Let's send a clear message that New York City will
23	always be a place where workers' justice matters.
24	I'd like to thank Committee staff for
