SERGEANT AT ARMS: Check one, two. Check one, two. This is a pre-recorded sound test for the Committee on Land Use. Today's date is August 6, 2024, being recorded by Michael Leonardo, City Council 16th Floor here.

SERGEANT AT ARMS: Good afternoon and welcome to today's New York City Council hearing for the Committee on Land Use. At this time, please silence all cell phones and electronic devices to minimize disruption throughout the hearing. At any time throughout the hearing, please do not approach the dais. Thank you for your kind cooperation. Chair, we are ready to begin.

CHAIRPERSON SALAMANCA: [GAVEL] Alright, good afternoon and welcome to the Committee on Land Use. I am Council Member Rafael Salamanca, Chair of this Committee. I would like to welcome my esteemed colleagues who have joined us today. We have been joined by Council Member Moya, Chair Riley, Abreu, Farias, Borelli, and Marmorato.

Today, we are voting on a number of items recommended by us and by our Zoning Subcommittee and as always, I would like to thank Chair Riley and Chair Hanks for their ongoing leadership. Today we

are voting on a number of proposals but we will begin
with the Bronx Metro North Plan. Today we will vote
to approve the modifications, this long awaited area
rezoning, which covers over 45 blocks in districts
represented by Council Members Marmorato, Majority
Leader Farias and Chair Riley. I wont repeat all
that was said by Chair Riley at our Zoning vote but I
do want to emphasize how important this initiative is
for our northern Bronx communities in addressing a
vision for sustainability, affordability, mixed use
neighborhoods around the floor plan new Metro rail
stations at Hunts Point, Parkchester, Van Ness,
Morris Park and Co-op City, which will serve as a
great need for the transit in the area.

We will be voting to approve modifications LU's 106, 107, 109 through 113. There's a package of Land Use actions which includes a Zoning Map Amendment, a related Zoning Text Amendment and five city map amendments to establish new street networks and a pedestrian plaza.

Overall, the plan is projected to rezone in approximately 7,000 new units of housing. Once again, I wont go into detail that Chair Riley explained earlier but our modifications include

various refinements to zoning districts, as well as associated densities and heights. To better relate to the area specific context in different areas.

Changes to the overall rezoning areas boundaries, maintaining parking requirements for future developments to help address area parking needs, and modifications to the proposed MIH options throughout the rezoning area.

The Council's modifications are intended to allow for much needed new affordable housing as well as jobs. All are taken into the account the context of existing neighborhoods and I'm excited to oversee this role here today.

I want to recognize that we've also been joined by Council Member Sanchez and Councilwoman Brooks-Powers via Zoom.

Moving on to our other items. We will also vote today to approve the modifications of LU 101-104 related to Arthur Kill Terminal proposed in Minority Leader Borelli's District. This project includes four related actions including a zoning text amendment, a special permit, a landfill action, and a city map amendment.

The project is intended to facilitate the siting of facilities and infrastructure to support the assembly of wind turbines. Modifications will ensure that in order to receive a city planning authorization for any needed flexibility in zoning that the project must support the city's green energy infrastructure, which the Arthur Kill Terminal does.

We will also vote to approve LU's 122 and 123, relating to the Prince Point Development proposal located at the southern end of Staten Island and also within Minority Leader Borelli's district. The requested actions include a City Map Amendment and Zoning Text Amendment, which together would facilitate the establishment of a new map street in the development of 108 detached single family homes in the Prince Bay neighborhood. And in the Special Southern Richmond Development District.

We will also vote to approve some modifications of LU's 114, 115, and 116, related to the 500 Kent Avenue Proposal located at Williamsburg neighborhood in Council Member Restler's District in Brooklyn.

The proposal includes a Zoning Map Amendment and two zoning special permits, which would facilitate the development of a new 23 story commercial office

building with ground floor retail, 234 parking spaces and publicly accessible open space, including a waterfront public access area. Modifications will be to clarify the process and applicant commitment to certain environmental mitigation measures related to the proposed development.

Also, in Council Member Restler's District, we will vote to approve some modifications LU's 120 and 121 related to the 712 Myrtle Avenue Proposal in the Bedford Stuyvesant neighborhood in Brooklyn. The project consists of a Zoning Map Amendment and a Zoning Text Amendment to facilitate the development of a new nine story mixed use building with approximately 62 units including 15 permanently affordable apartments and ground floor retail. A modification will be to strike MIH Option 2 and add the deep affordability option.

We will also be voting today to approve the modifications LU's 117 and 118 relating to the 3033 Avenue V Proposal in Sheepshead Bay neighborhood in Council Member Narcisse District in Brooklyn. This is a rezoning that includes a Zoning May Amendment and a Zoning Text Amendment, which will facilitate the development of a new nine story mixed-use

building with approximately 109 units, including 27 affordable apartments and ground floor retail. A modification here will also be to remove MIH Option 2 and add the deep affordability option.

For another project in Brooklyn, we will vote to approve LU's 119 related to 197 Barry Street Proposal in Williamsburg and within Council Member Gutiérrez's district in Brooklyn. This Proposal is a Zoning Map Amendment amended to facilitate the conversion of portions of an existing building to other conforming uses.

The final vote for today is a vote to disapprove LU's 124, a petitions by Wing's and Seafood and seeking a revokable consent for a sidewalk café at 785 Fairview Avenue in Council Member Holden's District in Queens. Council Member Holden prepared a statement, which was delivered earlier in full by Chair Riley at the Zoning Subcommittee, detailing Council Member Holden's position and reasons for recommending this approval.

To summarize very briefly here, the issues with the subject site include quality of lift concerns expressed by the member. Including the misuse of the existing outdoor dining structures at the

establishment. The inherent conflicts proposed at
this location with regard to adjacent uses, including
nearby subway entrances and prior authorized activity
by the applicant at this location resulting in the
Department of Building summonses for illegal
construction of dining structures on the sidewalk.

I would like to now recognize any of my colleagues for any comments or questions. Seeing none, I will call for a vote with the support of the local members to approve LU's 119, 122, 123 to approve the modifications of LU's 101, 102, 103, 104, 106, 107, 109, 110, 111, 112, 113, 114, 115, and 116, and 117, 118, 120 and 121 and to disapprove LU's 124, noting for the Committee that an aye vote on LU 124 will result in a disapproval of application. Will the clerk please call the roll?
