SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Sound check for the Committee on Finance. Today's date is December 5, 2024, being recorded by Danny Huang in the Council Chambers.

SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Good morning, and welcome to today's New York City Council hearing for the Committee on Finance.

Please silence all cell phone and electronic devices and do not approach the dais.

Chair, we're ready to begin.

CHAIRPERSON BRANNAN: [GAVEL] Okay, good morning and welcome to today's Finance Committee meeting. I'm Council Member Brannan, and I have the privilege of Chairing the Committee on Finance. We've been joined this morning by Council Members Salam, Carr, Powers, Ossé, Farías, Brewer, Ayala, Brooks-Powers, Hanks, Louis, and Williams. On Zoom, we've been joined by Sanchez, Stevens, and Moya.

Today, our Committee will be voting on four items, three Property Tax Exemption Resolutions and a Transparency Resolution. The first Property Tax Exemption Resolution is for a new partial 40-year Article XI exemption for preservation of one rental building in Council Member Dinowitz's District. As

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part of the exemption, the building will enter a regulatory agreement restricting rents, setting aside 50 percent of units for homeless tenants, and completing identified critical and short-term capital work. Upon closing of the Article XI exemption, HPD requires that the building work to clear all Housing Maintenance Code violations by designing a remediation plan and entering into a housing repair agreement with the Department.

exemptions are short-term retroactive Article V
exemption and a new partial 40-year Article XI
exemption respectively for preservation of two rental
buildings in Council Member Salaam's District. The
project was under an Article V exemption, which
expired in May of '22. HPD is requesting a new
Article XI to take effect once the project transfers
to an eligible HDFC, and for Article V to run
retroactive from the '22 expiration to the date of
the transfer to bridge the gap. As part of the
exemptions, the buildings will enter a regulatory
agreement, setting aside 30 percent of units for
homeless tenants, complete capital repairs, and
install aging-in-place improvements. During the

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2 Article V and the Article XI, income limits will be 3 capped at 50 percent of AMI.

Finally, the Transparency Resolution sets forth the new designation and changes in the designation of certain organizations receiving Local Youth, Anti-Poverty, and Speakers Initiative discretionary funding, and funding pursuant to certain initiatives in the budget. As with all Transparency Resolutions, Council Members will have to sign a disclosure form indicating whether or not a conflict exists with any of the groups on the attached list. If any Member has a potential conflict of interest with any of the organizations listed, they have the opportunity to disclose the conflict at the time of their vote. As a reminder, please disclose any conflicts you may have with proposed subcontractors used by organizations sponsored by discretionary funding. These disclosures must be made before the subcontractor can be approved. Disclosure forms must be completed and submitted prior to the vote on the Transparency Resolution, may be emailed to Everton Smith, who is also present in the building today to answer your questions.
