CHAIRPERSON AYALA: Thank you. (GAVEL SOUND)

(GAVELING IN) Good morning, everyone, and welcome to today's hearing. My name is Diana Ayala, and I am the Deputy Speaker of the New York City Council and the Chair of the General Welfare Committee.

This morning we will be voting on two bills.

The first bill, proposed Introduction 123-A, which I have sponsored, which would preclude DHS from requiting that every member of the family be present at a PATH intake center when the family seeks placement at a shelter.

Secondly, proposed Introduction 460-A, sponsored by Council Member Ung, would require DHS to report on

the feasibility of partnering with community based organizations to accept and process applications for shelter intake for families with children.

We know of the inefficiencies of the shelter application process for families with children. Families all across the City must travel to the PATH intake center located in the Bronx. Upon doing so, they often have to endure waiting on long lines -- many times with their children present -- with limited resources and staff interaction, while waiting for hours.

These bills seek to make that intake process easier and more accessible for families with children experiencing homelessness.

At this time, I would like to acknowledge my colleagues Council Member Riley, Council Member Restler, Council Member Stevens, Council Member Ung, and Council Member Banks.

Also, I would like to thank the committee staff who worked diligently to prepare this hearing and vote: Aminta Kilawan, Senior Legislative Counsel; Penina Rosenberg, Legislative Policy Analyst; Julia K. Haramis, Finance Unit Head; Phariha Rahman,

I will turn it over to Council Member Ung so that she can deliver remarks on her bill.

COUNCIL MEMBER UNG: I want to thank Chair Deputy
Speaker Ayala and my fellow committee members for
supporting Introduction 460 by sending this
legislation to City Council for a full vote. We are
taking an important step toward making our city
shelter system more accessible and compassionate for
homeless families and children.

We know that the first stop for many families in crisis is not the PATH intake center in the Bronx, but local community based organizations working tirelessly on the frontlines providing culturally competent services that our immigrant communities rely on. By requiring the Department of Homeless Services to study on the feasibility of partnering, this (INAUDIBLE) local not for profits to process shelters to process shelter intake applications, we are taking a common sense approach to serving homeless families where they are rather than making them come to us. Thank you again, and I look forward to the passage of Introduction 460.
