**Summary of Legislation:** This legislation would require the Department of Education (DOE) to submit a report regarding student access to home internet and electronic devices. The report must include district level data on the rates of students who do not have internet access or one personal electronic device at home, and are utilizing remote or blended learning, or a department-owned electronic device. Additionally, DOE must include analysis of how academic performance may be affected by access to internet and electronic devices, as well as recommendations on improving student access to home internet and electronic devices.

**Effective Date:** Immediately upon enactment
