In the interest of preserving NYC's rich cultural and immigrant history for future generations we, the Society of the Citizens of Pozzallo, respectfully request that the City of New York Co-Name Henry Street, from Sackett to Union Streets, "Citizens of Pozzallo Way" in honor of the many accomplishments the people of Pozzallo have made during their immigration to Brooklyn, New York City and the Country.

After over a century of time many of the Italian Immigrants from the town of Pozzallo have helped to make South Brooklyn, NYC and the United States a better place for all to live. Some of these outstanding individuals include War Heroes, Heroes of September 11th, Entrepreneurs, Artists, Football Hall of Famers, Sculptors, Politicians and even a citizen for whom the Vatican has started the process towards sainthood (beatification).

It is the feeling of the Society of the Citizens of Pozzallo, who have been located on Henry Street for almost 90 years, that a truly fair tribute to all these individuals should be done collectively, as not to overshadow one individual over another. For this reason the name of "Citizens of Pozzallo" collectively refers to the one thing that all of these outstanding "Citizens" have in common – their connection to the city of Pozzallo.


We regret that our organization was not afforded the opportunity on two different occasions to present our petition and respond to questions regarding our request and we appreciate that we now have been given this opportunity to address you in writing.

We began this process with the help of both the Brooklyn Borough President Marty Markowitz and Councilmember Bill DeBlasio before the new guidelines for street co-naming were issued. However, we feel that our request does conform to the recent changes in policy of the city council regarding street co-naming, as well as those of the DOT (both have been provided for you). You will also find that while Community Board 6 has only approved street co-naming for individuals, groups and organizations are allowed within the city's guidelines. Examples of such are Abolitionist Place on Duffield Street, Avenue of the Immigrants on Allen Street and Court Officer Memorial Way, which is in honor of 4 court officers, on Lafayette Street.

We are not asking for a street to be named in honor of every person from Pozzallo Italy nor are we asking for a street to be named after our city. We are asking that the outstanding individuals who have come from Pozzallo and whose enduring or lasting interest to large segments of the City's population or those who have undertaken an act or acts of enduring or lasting interest to this community and have reflected on the city of New York positively, be recognized by their connection as "Citizens of Pozzallo".

Please find attached copies of the new rules issued by the city council regarding street co-naming, the DOT rules for co-naming, a sample of six short bios of the outstanding Citizens of Pozzallo, a letter of endorsement from the Brooklyn Borough President, our organization's mission statement, photo of our society located on Henry Street, and a petition of 203 signatures, 47 of which are from Henry Street residents in support of the co-naming.

A sampling of some of those individuals of Pozzallo decent that we wish to honor:

Peter Joseph Sigona was awarded the Merchant Marine Distinguished Service Medal for meritorious service in the line of duty while serving as Master of SS Gulfprince in 1942. Sigona was responsible for the 71,000 bbls of crude oil, 8 officers, 34 crewmen on there way to New York City. After being attacked by a submarine one early morning Sigona steamed ahead with the enemy craft in pursuit. Captain Sigona kept his ship zigzagging, and by adroit maneuvers, caused two torpedoes to pass harmlessly astern and two others ahead. The ship outdistanced the submarine and escaped without damage to herself or injury to any of her crew. Peter Joseph Sigona was born in Pozzallo Sicily before immigrating to the South Brooklyn neighborhood of New York City.

Santo Matarazzo lived on Union Street for over 50 years after immigrating to Brooklyn from Pozzallo. Mr. Matarazzo brought with him from Sicily his talents as a master sculptor. Working on art productions and reproductions he was responsible for many pieces including the giant glob which now graces the grand hall of Ellis Island. Santo soon became known as "Mr. Brownstone" for his work in Brownstone restoration and rehabilitation throughout Brooklyn. When his age no longer permitted him to climb ladders and do his restoration work Santo turned to sculpting famous individuals including a bronze statue of William Floyd, signer of the Declaration of Independence, which stands in Brookhaven Long Island. At the time of his death Mr. Matarazzo was acclaimed by publications such as the New York Times and remembered for his lasting influence in Carroll Gardens in the local papers.

Joseph Agnello was a 35 year old member of Ladder 118 of the New York City Fire Department on the morning of September 11th 2001. Sadly Joseph was among those valiant heroes that were lost to us that morning. A proud son of Pozzallo Joseph Agnello defined what it means to be a hero on the morning of September 11th and will be remembered as such for all time.

John Buscema was the definitive Marvel superhero comics artist and co-author with Stan Lee of *How to Draw Comics the Marvel Way* (1976). Of all the fictional characters he drew, he was most renowned for his depictions of Conan the Barbarian and the Silver Surfer, which he made his own. The son of a barber from Pozzallo, John was raised by his parents in South Brooklyn and graduated Pratt Institute. Buscema's visual storytelling abilities proved highly accomplished: from the 1970s onward his archetypal style, at once sinewy and elegant, became synonymous with Marvel "look". Over the next three decades, at one time or other, he was to illustrate almost every title the company published, including Thor, Spider-Man, The Fantastic Four and The Avengers. But it was with two experimental series in particular that his name became associated: Silver Surfer and Conan the Barbarian. In the 1970's, Buscema founded his own art school, teaching a small group of students the Buscema style in a New York City hotel. Time and time again John worked to share his talents with future artist and train the young in the profession of illustration.

Giorgio La Pira was an Italian politician who served as mayor of Florence. He was born in Pozzallo Sicily to a modest family in 1904. La Pira viewed peace as the only way to solve the world's conflicts. From 1971 to 1973 La Pira traveled to New York to protest the military actions in Vietnam, calling for peace. La Pira was invited to Paris for the ceremony at the conclusion of the Peace Accords in Vietnam as a result of efforts. Until his death in 1977, La Pira promoted issues such as disarmament, the importance of third world development, and tolerance among world religions. In 1986, the Catholic Church began the process of Giorgio La Pira's beatification which has led to his current cause for Sainthood.

Piero Selvaggio - By expanding a small venture into a multi-million dollar business Piero Selvaggio has been able to bring the food of Italy, with authenticity and style, to the United States. Immigrating from Pozzallo Sicily to Brooklyn at the age of 18. Working his way through the restaurant industry, Piero opened his own restaurant Selvaggio and Valentino. In 1997 his restaurant was rated #1 in Wine Spectator's list of "America's 10 Best Italian Restaurants", was voted "America's Top Table" among Gourmet magazine's readers and was rated #1 by Ruth Reichl, then the restaurant critic of the New York Times, who praised the restaurant as the best Italian restaurant in America. Piero has been seen and heard regularly on radio and television shows as a leading source in the field of Italian foods and wines. Piero is well known for participating in charity events always keeping his ties with Italy through food, culture, events and activities, finding every opportunity to be a chef or guest at significant Italian events.


Dear Council Member de Blasio:

Subject: Standards and Procedure for Street Co-naming
Date: August 12, 2008

Attached please find the Council's Standards and Procedure for Street Co-naming. The new Standards and Procedure were established in consultation with the Speaker's Leadership Team, the Rules Reform Working Group, the Democratic Caucus and Council Member Helen Foster, Chair of the Parks and Recreation Committee. It is anticipated that the first omnibus bill drafted under the new procedure will be introduced and considered by the Council by the end of September. To expedite the process for the first omnibus bill, we will include only those proposed co-names for which Members currently have pending LS requests. We anticipate considering a second bill by December of 2008.

Standards for Council Consideration of Street Co-naming

Subjects Must Be either:

Individuals who are:

1. Deceased;
2. New York City residents or natives or individuals of particular importance to New York City;
3. Of enduring or lasting interest to large segments of the City's population or have undertaken an act or acts of enduring or lasting interest to their community; and
4. Whose importance to the City or whose enduring interest is a result of exemplary acts or achievements which reflect positively on the City. Or

Organizations:

1. Of particular importance to New York City;
2. Of enduring or lasting interest to large segments of the City's population that have undertaken acts of enduring or lasting interest; and
3. Whose importance to the City or whose enduring interest is a result of exemplary acts or achievements which reflect positively on the City.

Process for street co-naming

Member would submit an LS request for a proposed street co-naming and would be required to submit significant background information regarding the subject of the co-naming, including any negative information of which the member is aware. Members would be strongly urged to have Community Board approval of the proposed co-naming prior to submitting the LS request.

Central Staff would do a background analysis of the candidate that would consist of a review of the submitted information and Lexis/Nexis, Google or other Internet-based searches, as well as consultation with City historians or other experts when necessary. Staff would also confirm the district(s) affected by the proposed street co-naming. Staff would produce a memo outlining the results of the background analysis that would include all positive and negative/problematic information on the proposed co-naming subject and may flag such subject as in need of further consideration. Staff may only flag a proposed co-naming subject for further review if s/he has first consulted the sponsoring member.

The background analysis as well as all relevant vetting information submitted by sponsoring Member would be forwarded to all Council members. Members would have no more than twenty-one days within which to comment on any proposed co-naming.

Final Determination regarding proposed subjects for co-namings

After the Member comment period, those subjects who have not been flagged for further consideration would be included in an omnibus bill. There would be no fewer than two and no more than four such bills introduced and voted on by the Council each year.

Proposed co-namings that are flagged for further consideration would be submitted to the Speaker's Leadership team for final review. In addition, if during the comment period any member raises opposition to a proposed co-naming, that proposed co-naming along with the opposing member's opposition comments would be brought before the Leadership Team for final review. The sponsoring Member may present his/her position to the Leadership team prior to the final review. If the Leadership team determines that such proposed co-naming did not meet the standard for co-naming, then it would not be included in the omnibus bill but would, if the sponsoring Member insisted, be introduced individually in a separate bill.



CEREMONIAL STREET NAMING POLICY

EFFECTIVE SEPTEMBER 1, 2003 – UPDATED SEPTEMBER 1, 2007

Local Law Ceremonial Street Naming Process

1. A person or group sponsors the ceremonial name.
2. The person or group proposes the ceremonial name to the local Community Board.
3. The Community Board votes on the ceremonial name.
4. If the board approves the ceremonial name, it is presented to the City Council Member who represents the area for inclusion into a Council bill.
5. It is highly suggested that the Council Member designate a small block stretch for the naming and confirm the location of the placement of the sign with DOT prior to the passage of the bill.
6. The naming may only contain 36 characters and spaces so that it can adequately fit on a street sign.
7. Once the City Council passes the bill, it is given to the Mayor for his signature.
8. DOT will only honor requests for sign installation ceremonies once a local law authorizing the ceremonial name is signed by the Mayor and such requests must be made by the Council Member sponsoring the naming.
9. Requests for sign installation ceremonies must be presented to DOT at least three weeks or more in advance and DOT has final approval of this date.
10. Ceremonies should not be scheduled until the date has been confirmed by DOT.
11. DOT will install ONE street sign at DOT's expense. In no cases will more than one sign be installed regardless of the number of blocks named.
12. The sign will be installed at the location designated by the Council Member sponsoring the legislation and/or the family.
13. DOT will only place the sign on an existing street light pole or pole with an existing street name signs adhered to it.
14. DOT will have final approval of the placement of the sign.

Replica Signs

- DOT will manufacture one replica sign which is a street sign with the ceremonial name on one side.
- The family and Council Member may purchase additional replica signs for \$32 plus shipping and handling.
- DOT will not ship the additional replica signs to the family until DOT receives full payment for the additional signs.

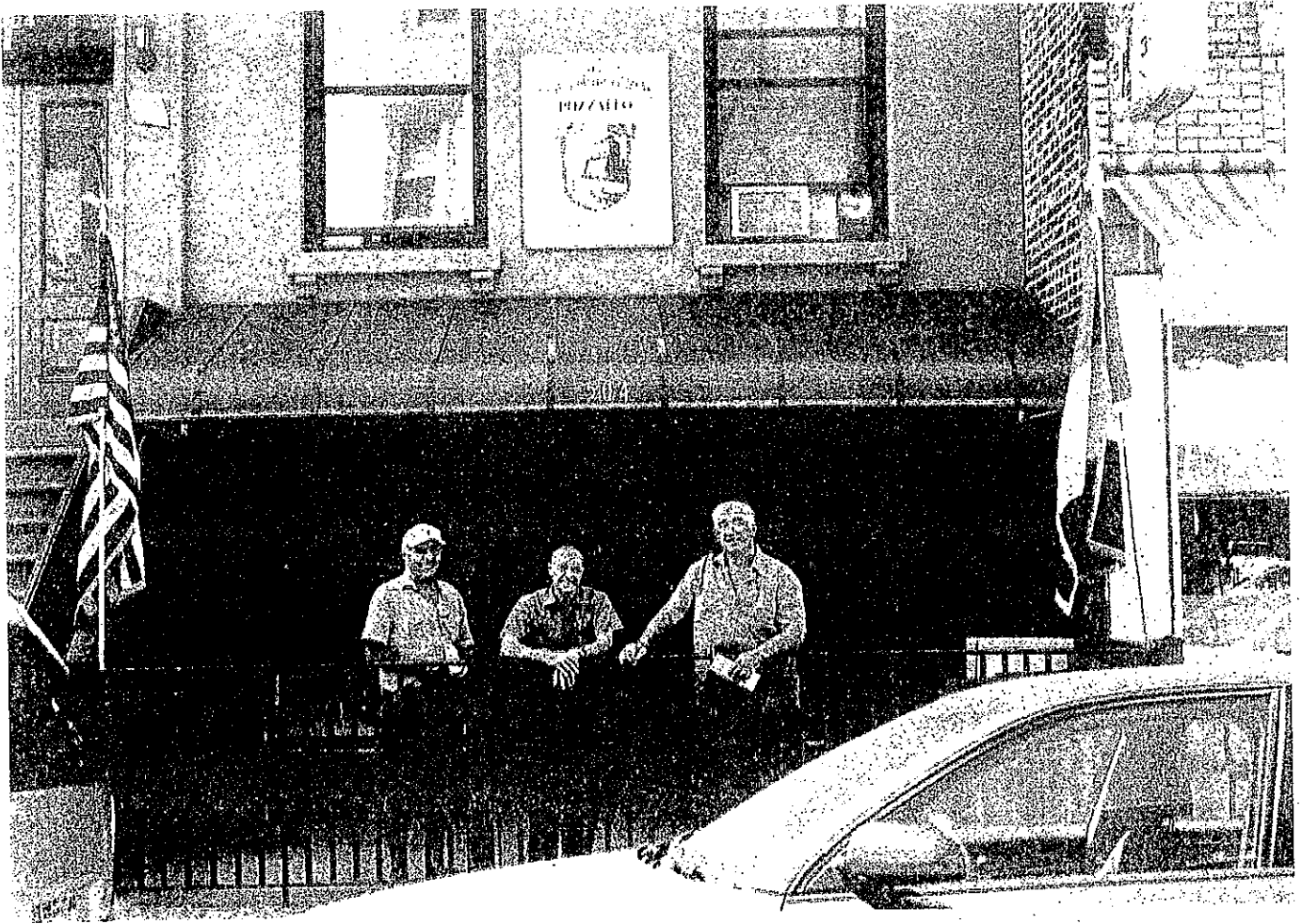

The Society of the Citizens of Pozzallo is a Brooklyn, New York based 501 (C) (3) Not For Profit Organization founded in 1919.

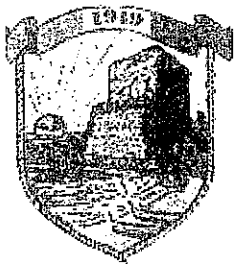

We endeavor to meet the above objectives through direct program initiatives and by participating as co-sponsor in programs that contribute to the attainment of the above stated mission.



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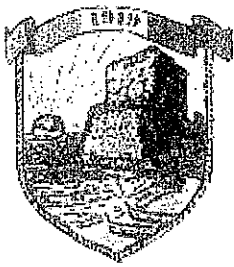
