City Planning as part of the City of Yes Initiative:

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Zoning for Economic Opportunity, or ZEO, and a companion ZEO proposal specifically to address manufacturing districts. These text amendments will have citywide capability and reflect a comprehensive update to the City's outdated framework of rules around commercial uses.

Earlier today in our Zoning Subcommittee,
Chair Riley described the Council's modifications in
detail, including our land use basis for such
modifications. A summary of all these modifications
has been provided for Committee Members in your
briefing documents. I will simply reiterate that the
Council's modifications are intended to respond to
the concerns raised clearly and consistently over the
course of the public review process from communities
and stakeholders citywide while, at the same time,
updating and aligning our zoning rules more closely
with the way the City functions today.

In addition to the modifications we will make to these text amendments, the City has secured key commitments from the Administration to further address the concerns we heard throughout this public process regarding regulatory enforcement in our communities of both the existing and the proposed

zoning regulations, the many problems that surround 2 3 last mile warehouses, and the need for the City to 4 further support and grow our industrial business community. I am pleased to report the following. The 5 Administration and Council will partner on advancing 6 7 legislation to regulate emissions associated with the 8 last mile warehouses. The Department of City Planning will advance a zoning change to regulate last mile warehouses via a City Planning Commission special 10 11 permit, and this will begin environmental review in March of 2025. To address concerns with the 12 Department of Building's capacity and enforcement, 13 the Council obtained a commitment from the 14 15 Administration for 4.7 million dollars to fund 60 new 16 full-time positions of the Department of Buildings in 17 order to staff a new proactive enforcement program 18 that will include follow-up inspections at problem 19 locations. The Administration will explore an 20 industrial incentive program that pairs zoning incentives with financial incentives, similar to the 21 2.2 existing FRESH program in order to attract and grow 2.3 industrial businesses in the city, and the Administration has committed to increase staffing of 24 the Office of Nightlife by four full-time staff in 25

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FY25 that will assist nightlife businesses in

complying with all laws and regulations. These added

resources will provide a nighttime swing shift to the

Office of Nightlife's outreach team to ensure these

businesses operate in compliance with regulations

during nighttime hours.

In addition to these votes on ZEO, we will also vote to approve LU 82 for the Sunnyside

Barnett Article XI tax exemption requested in Council

Member Won's District in Queens, and we are also

voting to approve LU 74 related to the 15-21 West

124th Street proposal in Council Member Salaam's

District in Manhattan. This proposed zoning text

amendment will facilitate the development of a new

residential building in Harlem with 33 units.

At this time, I would like to welcome my Colleagues who wish to ask questions or make remarks.

Seeing none, I will now call for a vote with the support of the local Members to approve LUs 74 and 82, to approve with modifications LUs 55 and 56. Will the Clerk please call the roll.
