SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: This is a mic check, this is a mic check on the vote on Consumer and Worker Protection. Today's date is September 25, 2025. Recorded in 250 Broadway, HR 3. Recorded by Walter Lewis.

SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Good morning, and welcome to the New York City Council vote on the Committee on Consumer and Worker Protection.

At this time, please silence all electronics and do not approach the dais.

Chair, you may begin.

CHAIRPERSON MENIN: [GAVEL] Good morning. My name is Julie Menin, and I'm Chair of the Committee on Consumer and Worker Protection. Welcome to our vote on Proposed Introduction Number 780-A, aligning the requirements of the Earn Safe and Sick Time Act and the Temporary Schedule Change Act, sponsored by Council Member Nurse.

I first want to recognize my fellow Council Members who are here, Council Member Nurse, Council Member Abreu, Majority Leader Farías, Council Member Krishnan, and I'll acknowledge others as they join.

2 In June 2013, New York City became the 3 seventh and the largest U.S. jurisdiction to provide 4 workers with a legal right to paid sick leave with the passage of the Earned Sick Time Act. As Commissioner of the Department of Consumer and Worker 6 7 Protection, I was proud to implement New York City's 8 landmark Paid Sick Leave Law, which has provided millions of workers with the security to care for themselves and their loved ones without fear of 10 11 losing their job or reprisals. Our City Council 12 expanded upon this landmark bill in 2017 by giving 13 employees a right to save time from work to address 14 issues related to domestic violence, sexual assault, 15 stalking, or human trafficking, and expanded the definition of family to include chosen as well as 16 biological family members. The Council built on the 17 18 Earned Safe and Sick Leave Act in 2018 with the 19 passage of the Temporary Schedule Change Act, which 20 protects employees who seek temporary changes to 21 their work schedules for personal events and certain 2.2 other schedule changes. Proposed introduction 780-A 2.3 would provide New Yorkers with more protected reasons to take time off of work to care for themselves or 24 their loved ones. The bill expands the reasons a 25

worker can use paid, safe, and sick time, enabling workers to care for their children or family members with disabilities. It would also allow workers to use safe and sick time for certain legal obligations such as a fair hearing for SNAP benefits or a housing court date. The bill would also provide workers with 32 hours of unpaid safe and sick leave in lieu of two temporary schedule changes offered under the Temporary Schedule Change Act, making the law's requirements less confusing for workers and employers alike.

I now want to turn it over to Council Member Nurse for her statement.

COUNCIL MEMBER NURSE: Thank you, Chair.

I'll keep it brief.

As we know, work demands more and more of our time and all of the data shows that our wages are lagging far behind the amount of time that we're required to be doing things and productive. And so today we're passing a bill in spirit of protecting and expanding workers' rights by passing Intro. 780, which will give millions of private sector workers more time off from work to care for themselves and their loved ones without fearing for their jobs or

2	well-being. Intro. 780 expands New York City's paid,
3	safe, and sick leave by giving covered workers 32 new
4	hours, or four days, of unpaid safe and sick leave.
5	Workers will not have to accrue this time as they do
6	for paid time off and will get 32 new hours each
7	calendar year. This undoubtedly positions New York
8	City's paid safe and sick leave law as the strongest
9	in the country and it'll make it much easier to raise
10	a family in the city or to care for your parents or
11	to keep yourself safe or if you have to go enroll in
12	public benefits or other critical needs.
13	And I want to thank the DCWP Committee
14	Staff, bill drafter Sarah Swain, as well as Legal Aio
15	and A Better Balance for their partnership.
16	Thank you, Chair.
17	CHAIRPERSON MENIN: Great, thank you. And
18	now I ask the Clerk to call the roll.
