**Summary of Legislation:** This legislation would require the Department of Transportation (DOT) to offer the opportunity for special activation of the Open Streets program on certain holidays, including, but not limited to, Memorial Day, Juneteenth, Fourth of July, Labor Day, and Halloween, and during time periods with significant pedestrian traffic. DOT's short-form application to renew an Open Street program must include an opportunity to request these special activation opportunities. DOT must also provide procedures by which community organizations may participate in or suggest new special activation opportunities.

**Effective Date:** 30 days after enactment
