Today we will be voting on Proposed

Introduction number 134-A, a bill that aims to ensure transparency and accountability at the JFK Airport Redevelopment Project. This legislation, sponsored by Majority Whip Selvena Brooks-Powers, builds upon the feedback we received from several stakeholders,

including the Economic Development Corporation and
community members during our oversight hearing on the
JFK Redevelopment Project last month. Proposed Intro.
number 134-A would require the Economic Development
Corporation to submit an annual report to key elected
officials, including the Speaker of the Council, the
Queens Borough President, and the Council Member
representing JFK. This report would provide critical
information on the progress of the JFK Redevelopment
Plan and the associated community benefits package.
The report would need to include details on the JFK
Redevelopment Project's scope, timeline, and budget
as well as actions taken by the Port Authority
related to the Redevelopment Plan. The goal here is
to ensure a comprehensive overview of the
Redevelopment Plan's progress and impact on the
surrounding community. By voting in favor of this
legislation, we are taking a significant step towards
ensuring that there is transparency and
accountability throughout the remaining term of the
JFK Redevelopment Project. This bill also sends a
clear message to the Port Authority that the
communities most impacted by their airport operations
