Int 0144-2004 A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to prohibiting the sale of a rifle or shotgun to anyone under twenty-one years of age and requiring dealers in rifles and shotguns to collect additional information from ammunition purchasers.

Int 0365-2004 A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to a cause of action against firearms manufacturers and dealers.

Proposed Int. No. 365-A

Int 0469-2004 A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to assault weapons.

Proposed Int. No. 469-A

Int 0490-2004 A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to limiting the acquisition of a rifle or shotgun to one per ninety-day period.

Proposed Int. No. 490-A

Res 0049-2004 Resolution calling upon the Governor and the New York State Legislature to amend that section of the New York State General Business Law known as the Pistol and Revolver Ballistic Identification Databank Law, to require that assault weapons, rifles and other long-barreled weapons be included in New York State's ballistics fingerprint database.

- Res 0078-2004** Resolution calling upon the New York State Legislature to amend various sections of the Penal Law to better combat illegal gun trafficking.

- Res 0085-2004** Resolution calling upon the United States Congress to approve legislation that establishes a national ballistics fingerprint database.

- Res 0597-2004** Resolution calling on the State Legislature to amend the Penal Law to include the denial of a weapons permit for any applicant convicted of violating New York City's assault weapons ban.
