ACTING CHAIRPERSON ABREU: [GAVEL] Good morning. I am Council Member Sean Abreu, and I'm sitting in for Chair Menin of the Committee on Consumer and Worker Protection.

Welcome to today's vote on Proposed Intro
Number 1049-A. I would like to recognize my fellow
Committee Members, Brewer, Menin, Krishnan.

It seems to be standard practice that gas stations will authorize self-service machines to place pre-authorization holds on a consumer's credit or debit card in an amount that is greater than the

actual transaction amount. Gas stations do this
because if a consumer uses a self-service machine, it
is unknown how much petroleum the person will buy
until after the transaction is complete. However,
consumers may be unaware of this pre-authorization
hold, which could be greater than the amount the
consumer has in their bank account, resulting in an
overdraft fee or a declined transaction. Proposed
Intro. Number 1049-A, sponsored by Council Member
Brooks-Powers, would address this issue by requiring
any person who imposes a pre-authorization hold on
the retail sale of petroleum to post a written notice
that includes information about the initiation of the
hold, the amount of the hold, and the ways a consumer
could avoid a hold. The written notice will be
displayed where payment for petroleum is accepted.
