SERGEANT AT ARMS: Good morning and welcome to the New York City Council Vote of the Committee on Education. At this time, can everybody please silence your cell phones? At this time and going forward, no one is to approach the dais. I repeat, no one is to approach the dais. Chair, we are ready to begin.

CHAIRPERSON JOSEPH: [gavel] Good morning and welcome everyone to today's Committee on Education vote on Proposed Introduction 118A sponsored by Deputy Speaker Ayala, a Local Law in relation to posting information and reporting on dress code policies in New York City Public Schools and to repeal Section 2 of such law upon expiration thereof. We will consider Resolution 292 sponsored by Council Member Stevens which call upon the New York City Department of Education to create an inclusive school dress code policy that complies with Title IX of the Federal Education Amendments Act and accounts for diverse cultures, gender expression, and body diversity. The Committee previously heard testimony on Introduction 118 and Resolution 292 as part of a June 18th hearing on several pieces of legislation. Since that hearing several amendments

were made to Introduction 118. Proposed Introduction
118A would require the New York City Public Schools
to post to dress code policies on its websites and
report on dress code policies in New York City Public
Schools, including information about whether each
school has a dress code policy and data on dress code
violations and penalties broken down by month, week,
and student race and gender. The report required in
this bill would cease after five years. The goal of
Resolution 292 is to protect students from unfair
enforcement of discriminatory and gender biased dress
code standards in schools to ensure that students are
not subject to mistreatment or discrimination as a
result of their clothing, and to create school
environments that are safer and more inclusive spaces
for all young people. I'm proud to have signed as a
co-sponsor of these two important pieces of
legislation, and I encourage all of my colleagues to
vote yes on both. I'd like to thank my staff,
Committee Staff. I will now turn over to Clerk to
call the roll. Hold on one second. I'd like to
acknowledge Council Member Shekar, Council Member
Lee, Council Member Dinowitz, Council Member
Schulman. Council Member Narcisse, and Council Member
