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2 SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: This is a mic check for  
3 the Committee on Health. Today's date is December 17,  
4 2025. We are in Hearing Room 1, and this is being  
5 recorded by Mike Kane (phonetic).

7 Thank you. Good morning, and welcome to today's New  
8 York City Council vote for the Committee on Health.

12 Chair, we are ready to begin.

13 CHAIRPERSON SCHULMAN: [GAVEL] Good  
14 morning, everyone. My name is Lynn Schulman, Chair of  
15 the New York City Council's Committee on Health. I  
16 want to welcome you all to today's vote. We've been  
17 joined by the following Members, Council Members  
18 Menin, Ariola Narcisse, De La Rosa, Felder, and Feliz  
19 on Zoom.

20 Today, we'll be voting on Proposed  
21 Resolution 1061-A, sponsored by Majority Leader  
22 Amanda Fariás, calling on the New York State  
23 Legislature to pass and the Governor to sign  
24 legislation requiring pain management options to be  
25 offered to patients undergoing in-office gynecologic

procedures. Despite 10.4 percent of women aged 15 to 49 currently utilizing long-acting reversible contraceptives including intrauterine devices, IUDs for short, or contraceptive implants, women often experience pain when undergoing the procedure which goes untreated. A study found that 96.8 percent of TikToks which discuss patient experiences regarding IUD insertion highlight pain and other negative side effects. Meanwhile, ACOG reports that there is an urgent need for healthcare professionals to take the pain experienced by their patients seriously. This recommendation is especially pertinent for Black Americans who are systematically undertreated for pain. This Resolution calls on the State to take these recommendations and experiences into account. Ensuring that pain management options are offered to patients undergoing in-office gynecologic procedures is crucial to ensuring all birthing people receive the healthcare they deserve free of unnecessary pain and suffering.

I want to thank the Majority Leader for her leadership on this issue as well as my Colleagues, Legislative Staff, and the advocates for working to move this Resolution forward.
