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CHAIRPERSON SALAMANCA: [GAVEL] All right, good afternoon, and welcome to the Committee on Land Use. I am Council Member Rafael Salamanca. I Chair this Committee.

I would like to welcome my esteemed Colleagues who have joined us today. We've been joined by Council Member Moya, Chair Riley, Brooks-Powers, Abreu, Majority Leader Farías, Chair Hanks, Hudson, Sanchez, and Borelli.

Today, we will vote on a number of items recommended to us by our Zoning and Landmarks

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Subcommittee, and I would like to thank Chair Riley and Chair Hanks for their work leading those two Subcommittees.

Today, we will vote to approve LUs 35 and 36 for the East Tremont Cluster NCP Project related to property located in Council Member Feliz's District in the Bronx. The proposal includes a UDAAP designation, project approval, and related disposition approval along with an Article XI tax exemption request. Together, these actions would facilitate the development of three new buildings with approximately 64 affordable housing units including 20 affordable units for seniors.

We will also vote to approve LUS 41, 42, 43, 46, and 47 for the 431 10th Street Redevelopment Proposal related to property in Council Member Avilés' District in Brooklyn. The project includes five Land Use actions including a zoning map change from R6A to R7-3 with a C2-4 commercial overlay, a zoning text amendment to establish MIH areas on the site, two zoning special permits to allow for modifications of the underlying bulk and parking requirements, and a property tax exemption request. Together, these actions will facilitate the creation

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of approximately 305 new units, including 162 affordable units, the preservation of an existing building with existing rent-stabilized units, and a ground floor commercial space and new open space on the site.

We will also vote to approve LUS 51, 52, and 62 for the Melrose Concourse NCP Project related to property in Council Member Stevens' District in the Bronx. The proposal includes a UDAAP designation, project approval, and a related disposition, an acquisition action for a portion of one of the project sites, an Article XI tax exemption request. These actions will facilitate the development of three new buildings with approximately 71 affordable units including 23 affordable senior units.

We will also vote to approve LUs 53 and 54 for the Genesis MPLP Project related to property in Council Member Salaam's District in Manhattan. The proposal would include a UDAAP designation, project approval and related disposition, and an Article XI property tax exemption request. These actions would facilitate the rehabilitation and preservation of eight buildings with approximately 85 affordable units.

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we will also vote to approve LU 5/ for
the Citywide Gaming Facility Text Amendment. This
proposed text amendment would allow applicants to
submit development proposals for casino use in New
York City with the State's review framework which
establishes a local review process for site plan
approval. As Chair Riley noted at the Subcommittee, I
want to reiterate that we are not voting on any
specific proposal in any specific location. We are
only providing applicants the ability through
tailored zoning text to compete for one of the
maximum three Downstate gaming licenses.

We will also vote to approve LU 58 for the 41 Richard Street application concerning property located in Council Member Avilés' District in Brooklyn. The application consists of a zoning map amendment to change an existing M1-1 district to a M1-5 district and would facilitate the development of a new eight-story mixed-use industrial commercial building.

We will also vote to approve LU 61 for the 80-01 Broadway Commercial Overlay Proposal related to property in Council Member Krishnan's District in Queens. The application consists of a zoning map amendment to legalize existing commercial use along an active commercial corridor along

4 Broadway.

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Finally, we will also vote to approve LU 63, the disposition of property located at 97-22 Cresskill Place in Council Member Williams' District in Queens. Under this application, the Department of Citywide Administrative Services seeks disposition approval of a City-owned property currently under jurisdiction of the New York City Department of Sanitation.

I would now like to recognize any of my Colleagues who wish to make comments or have questions.

I will now recognize Council Member Avilés.

COUNCIL MEMBER AVILÉS: Thank you, Chair, so much for the opportunity to address the Members and the public.

I am Council Member Alexa Avilés, representing District 38, a District which recently expanded to include the area where the project 341 10th Street in Park Slope is located. As we are all very aware, our city is experiencing a housing

to these tenants including significant capital

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improvements and renovations. Due to the complex conditions at this site, which involved building over a capped MTA subway tracks and unique benefits of the full package, including the preservation of existing affordable housing and the construction of a new 100 percent deeply affordable building, I am reluctantly agreeing to allow the MIH Workforce Option to apply to the 10th Street building. However, I am proud to announce that through our negotiations, Stellar has committed to providing significantly deeply affordable units in the building as I mentioned before at 50 percent and 70 percent AMI, which is over and above the Workforce requirements. All together, this package of new construction and preservation of permanently affordable units will provide critically needed housing for those in our community. Finally, this project will bring improvements, not only for existing and new residents, but the plan includes an activation of ground floor retail along the 9th Street and enhancement of a long-awaited public outdoor space. The application team, Stellar, has worked with three different Council Members to land where we are today. At each iteration, we've increased the affordability

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of the units, and I would like to thank the team for their diligence and effort on this project, but I must also thank the tenants of 341 themselves, and many longstanding residents of the community and the Fifth Avenue Committee. I look forward to continuing to be involved in this development until all agreements are fulfilled, and we will see this much needed housing come to fruition. Thank you.

Lastly, I'd like to comment on the application for 41 Richards Street. This application, we are in wholehearted support of and, while the application has asked for rezoning from an M1-1 to an M1-5, while this applicant and property is not in the IBZ, the property owner is deeply committed to industrial manufacturing, of which we are very pleased and worked very diligently over a long period of time with the community to be responsive to our commitments for industrial manufacturing and, in fact, is building a building that is going to be really centering those needs in our community so I just want to thank Mr. Tampakis for being so responsive to the community needs, to the Southwest Brooklyn Industrial Corporation for being a thought partner on the project and making sure that our needs
